Psalm 108 – Psalm 119, 1 Corinthians 15 (15:34) – 2 Corinthians 4

Psalm 108: Your truth reaches to the sky

Key Point:

We can find confidence and internal strength when we proclaim our belief that God is ruler over all.

Key Verse - Psalm 108:4 (NLT)

or Your mercy is great above the heavens, And Your truth reaches to the skies.

Psalm 109: Give the wicked their due

Key Point:

It is okay to pour out our frustrations and desires to the Lord when we are under attack, because that will lead us to confidence that God will have our back in the end.

Key Verse - Psalm 109:20 (NLT)

May this be the reward of my accusers from the Lord, And of those who speak evil against my soul.

Psalm 110: the Lord to my Lord

Key Point:

God calls the Messiah God. Messiah is both king and priest forever.

Key Verse – Psalm 110:1 (NLT)

The Lord says to my Lord: “Sit at My right hand until I make Your enemies a footstool for Your feet.”

Psalm 111: God’s works are studied

Key Point:

If we study about what God has made, that should lead us to fear Him all the more.

Key Verse - Psalm 111:2 (NLT)

Great are the works of the Lord; They are studied by all who delight in them.

Psalm 112: Delight in His commands**Key Point:**

Heaven is our reward, but even in this life, those who fear the Lord will be blessed and steady in heart.

Key Verse - Psalm 112:1 (NLT)

Praise the Lord! Blessed is a person who fears the Lord, Who greatly delights in His commandments.

Psalm 113: From the rising sun**Key Point:**

The Lord is to be praised above all, because He is higher than all nations and kings. He rescues the poor and needy.

Key Verse - Psalm 113:3 (NLT)

Everywhere—from east to west—praise the name of the Lord.

Psalm 114: Judah became His**Key Point:**

God rescues His people and the land will rejoice someday.

Key Verse - Psalm 114:1 – 2 (NLT)

When the Israelites escaped from Egypt—when the family of Jacob left that foreign land—2 the land of Judah became God's sanctuary, and Israel became his kingdom.

Psalm 115: Our God is theirs**Key Point:**

Anything material that people put their trust in is a fool's hope, because those things are not God and cannot do anything for anyone.

Key Verse - Psalm 115:3 – 4 (NLT)

Our God is in the heavens, and he does as he wishes. 4 Their idols are merely things of silver and gold, shaped by human hands.

Psalm 116: God hears**Key Point:**

God will deliver our souls after death and preserve us, so we should be utterly loyal to Him in this life.

Key Verse - Psalm 116:1 (NLT)

I love the Lord because he hears my voice and my prayer for mercy.

Psalm 117: Laud Him

Key Point:

God is faithfulness itself and faithfulness endures forever.

Key Verse - Psalm 117:1 (NLT)

Praise the Lord, all you nations. Praise him, all you people of the earth.

Psalm 118: The rejected cornerstone

Key Point:

Trusting in people or the things of this world is foolish, because only God is eternal. Put your trust in the Lord because He exalts what others think is worthless.

Key Verse - Psalm 118:22 (NLT)

The stone that the builders rejected has now become the cornerstone.

Psalm 119: Hidden in my heart

Key Point:

Choose to love God's Word because, it is the source of all truth, guidance, joy, comfort, peace, deliverance and salvation.

Key Verse - Psalm 119:11 (NLT)

I have hidden your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you.

1 Corinthians 15: First importance

Key Point:

Our present bodies will be resurrected, either after death or at the rapture, because they are corrupted by sin now, and sin cannot inherit the kingdom. But just as a seed dies before it sprouts, so we must go through this process.

Key Verse - 1 Corinthians 15:3 (NLT)

I passed on to you what was most important and what had also been passed on to me. Christ died for our sins, just as the Scriptures said.

1 Corinthians 16: First day collection

Key Point:

We should be givers, we should acknowledge those who help, and be respectful of leadership as we stand fast in the virtues the Lord has given us to by them.

Key Verse - 1 Corinthians 16:2 (NLT)

On the first day of each week, you should each put aside a portion of the money you have earned. Don't wait until I get there and then try to collect it all at once.

2 Corinthians 1: Comfort in abundance

Key Point:

There will always be accusations against men and women of God, but our actions should demonstrate the genuineness of our convictions and leadership.

Key Verse - 2 Corinthians 1:5 (NLT)

For the more we suffer for Christ, the more God will shower us with his comfort through Christ.

2 Corinthians 2: Forgive the repentant

Key Point:

When someone repents, we ought to forgive and comfort that person, because the message of the gospel is a sweet fragrance rather than a legalistic hammer.

Key Verse - 2 Corinthians 2:6 – 7 (NLT)

Most of you opposed him, and that was punishment enough. 7 Now, however, it is time to forgive and comfort him. Otherwise he may be overcome by discouragement.

2 Corinthians 3: We are being transformed

Key Point:

The new covenant in Jesus is bold, it brings us into intimacy with God, and from this we are being changed to become more and more like Jesus.

Key Verse: 2 Corinthians 3:18 (NLT)

So all of us who have had that veil removed can see and reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord—who is the Spirit—makes us more and more like him as we are changed into his glorious image.

2 Corinthians 4: Future glory

Key Point:

God may use our suffering in this life to create a testimony and we should not lose heart, because the promise of coming eternal glory is so great it wipes out our momentary light affliction in this life.

Key Verse - 2 Corinthians 4:17 (NLT)

For our present troubles are small and won't last very long. Yet they produce for us a glory that vastly outweighs them and will last forever!
