# **Isaiah 5: Vineyard of bitter grapes**

# Isaiah 13: Vision of Babylon's fall

	<b>Key Point:</b> The prophecy against Babylon has been literally fulfilled and can be seen today – and since this prophecy is linked to the end times we can have no doubt that God's judgment on this evil world is coming.
	<u>Key Verse - Isaiah 13:19 (NLT)</u> Babylon, the most glorious of kingdoms, the flower of Chaldean pride, will be devastated like Sodom and Gomorrah when God destroyed them.
<u>Isaiah</u>	14: Many fallings
	<b>Key Point:</b> Prideful kings and nations will find they are as weak as anyone else when judgment comes and their pride is cut down, because no one can resist the will of the one true God.
	Key Verse - Isaiah 14:27 (NLT) The Lord of Heaven's Armies has spoken - who can change his plans? When his hand is raised, who can stop him?"
<u>Isaiah</u>	15: Moabite Lament
	Key Point: Those who think, in their pride, that they are immune to destruction can be judged by God suddenly.
	<u>Key Verse - Isaiah 15:5 (NLT)</u> My heart weeps for Moab. Its people flee to Zoar and Eglath-shelishiyah. Weeping, they climb the road to Luhith Their cries of distress can be heard all along the road to Horonaim.
<u>Isaiah</u>	16: Three years to a Moabite reckoning
	Key Point: Pride leads to judgment, even of small countries or what others may consider an insignificant life, but God is merciful to warn.

<b>Key Verse</b>	<u>.</u>	Isaiah	16:5	(NLT)

	<b>Key Point:</b> There is no point in boasting about temporary achievements in this life. Knowing the Lord, and living a life dedicated to Him, is smarter so we should leave past mistakes behind and live heartily unto the Lord.
