**Numbers 28: Offering reminders**

**Key Point:**

God wants us to thoughtfully engage in relationship with Him and what is special to us that we give to Him, is also special and pleasing to Him.

**Key Verse: Numbers 28:2 (NLT)**

“Give these instructions to the people of Israel: The offerings you present as special gifts are a pleasing aroma to me; they are my food. See to it that they are brought at the appointed times and offered according to my instructions.”

**Numbers 29: Feast offerings**

**Key Point:** The feast days were intended for celebration and reflection so we also should regularly celebrate our God, reflect on what He has done and give special, from-the-heart gifts to Him.

**Key Verse: Numbers 29:39 (NLT)**

“You must present these offerings to the Lord at your annual festivals. These are in addition to the sacrifices and offerings you present in connection with vows, or as voluntary offerings, burnt offerings, grain offerings, liquid offerings, or peace offerings.”

**Numbers 30: Confirming vows**

**Key Point:** There is a hierarchy of authority from God’s point of view. A woman should be in submission to her husband and a husband cannot neglect his responsibility to care for and lead his wife and daughters.

**Key Verse: Numbers 30:15 (NLT)**

If he waits more than a day and then tries to nullify a vow or pledge, he will be punished for her guilt.”

**Numbers 31: Destroying Midian**

**Key Point:** It is God who judges people and brings about the consequences of sexual immorality and idolatry upon people. Since God created life, He has the right to determine who will live.

**Key Verse: Numbers 31:2 (NLT)**

“On behalf of the people of Israel, take revenge on the Midianites for leading them into idolatry. After that, you will die and join your ancestors.”

**Numbers 32: Reuben & Gad stay east**

**Key Point:** Finding excuses to try and get out of our duty to do what God is leading us to do will be found out – so it is best to follow through.

**Key Verse: Numbers 32:1 (NLT)**

The tribes of Reuben and Gad owned vast numbers of livestock. So when they saw that the lands of Jazer and Gilead were ideally suited for their flocks and herds...

**Numbers 33: Summary of the wandering**

**Key Point:** God gives plenty of warning of coming judgment so we cannot afford to compromise with the world in any way.

**Key Verse: Numbers 33:2 (NLT)**

At the Lord’s direction, Moses kept a written record of their progress. These are the stages of their march, identified by the different places where they stopped along the way.

**Numbers 34: The borders of Canaan**

**Key Point:** It is God who determines the boundaries of the nations no matter what we may think in terms of invasions and such. Whatever happens that creates a nation is ultimately God’s allowance.

**Key Verse: Numbers 34:2 (NLT)**

“Give these instructions to the Israelites: When you come into the land of Canaan, which I am giving you as your special possession, these will be the boundaries.

**Numbers 35: Cities of refuge**

**Key Point:** Murder is serious because it destroys the image of God – but murder that is ignored or bought off pollutes the land.

**Key Verse: Numbers 35:15 (NLT)**

These cities are for the protection of Israelites, foreigners living among you, and traveling merchants. Anyone who accidentally kills someone may flee there for safety.

**Numbers 36: No land transfers**

**Key Point:** God is both reasonable and fair. He wants us to be equitable and fair in our dealings with one another also.

**Key Verse: Numbers 36:7 (NLT)**

None of the territorial land may pass from tribe to tribe, for all the land given to each tribe must remain within the tribe to which it was first allotted.

**Mark 14: Betrayed**

**Key Point:**

Every part of the trial and execution of Jesus was immoral, illegal and irrational but Jesus endured it by His own choice so that His death was an act of the willful attack of ungodly men and the willful submission of the God-man.

**Key Verse: Mark 14:62 (NLT)**

Jesus said, "I am. And you will see the Son of Man seated in the place of power at God's right hand and coming on the clouds of heaven.

**Mark 15: Crucified & Buried**

**Key Point:**

The crucifixion of Jesus was brutal, fatal, and witnessed so there is no historical evidence it was incomplete, misunderstood, or misplaced (wrong tomb).

**Key Verse: Mark 15:2 (NLT)**

Pilate asked Jesus, "Are you the king of the Jews?" Jesus replied, "You have said it."
