A Jesus Exalting Partnership

5:12-28

vs. 12, Brothers and sisters give recognition to those who labor among you and lead (care for) you in the Lord and admonish (instruct) you.

Labor -> Hard work, diligence, endurance and reliability

vs. 13, regard them very highly in love

Leaders are to be the model.

What does it look like to walking in the ways of Jesus?

They are role models in the midst who set the example of kingdom living.

1:3 We recall, in the presence of our God and Father, your work produced by faith, your labor motivated by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

2:9 For you remember our labor and hardship, brothers and sisters. Working night and day so that we would not burden any of you, we preached God's gospel to you.

3:5 For this reason, when I could no longer stand it, I also sent him to find out about your faith, fearing that the tempter had tempted you and that our labor might be for nothing.

Themes for the Thessalonians:

- Endurance
- Faithfulness (loyalty)
- Staying on course
- Ongoing commitment to holiness
- · Obedience to the will of God

As leaders of Second Mile it is our commitment to faithfully serve.

When a community is stressed and under pressure it will often become self-focused in order to endure (self-preservation).

It is in these moments where division, disruption, and just plain annoyance can begin to germinate and rapidly spread.

Question: Are you noticing a bit of this? What would Second Mile's annual check-up reveal? Are you the part of the body that is hurt, tired, or just troublesome?

Paul knows this and so he gives the instruction...

Be at peace among yourselves.

Be a brother or sister who regards others more highly than yourself.

Seek the good of others and don't be self-focused.

Be a person who cultivates patience in their everyday routines (5:15).

vs. 14, We exhort (urge) you.

- Warn those who are idol (rebellious, trouble makers those who complain, gossip, stir up problems rather than peace in the community.
- · Comfort the discouraged
- Help the weak
- Be patient with everyone

Show your church family and the world around you the sharp contrast between how a Jesus follower interacts and engages.

Question: Real, tangible summer application. How can you take the advice of Paul this summer? Are there those whom you interact with that need to be warned? Who has God put around you that he wants to use you to comfort and help them? How do we grow in patience? All of us are in need of patience!

vs. 15. Do not repay evil for evil

Pursue - What is good (for one another and for all)

What is the underlying posture / attitude / virtue to all of this?

Love (vs. 13) - the glue that sustains the church. Shepherds - Sheep - Family

Question: Do you love Second Mile? How do you show it?

vs. 16-18,

Rejoice always All of this is God's will

Pray constantly

Give thank in everything

What is God up to? What is his will? Paul is speaking very directly into the mindset of a Greek thinker.

Not so with you (child of God).

What is the covenantal will of God through the Messiah Jesus? Daily Bread -> joy, prayer, thanksgiving

When we are aware of His (Holy Spirit's) presence we can not help but be filled with Joy and Thanksgiving!

Question: Are you engaged with your Savior? Do you live and breathe (each breath) with an awareness of the Holy Spirit's activity all around you? What needs to change in order for you to experience a steady stream oof joy and thanksgiving?

vs. 19-22.

- · Don't stifle (quench) the Spirit.
- Don't despise prophecies, but test all things.
- Hold on to what is good.
- · Stay away from every kind of evil.

vs. 23-24, Formed by God (Spiritual formation)

What is this spiritual formation? It is completeness (wholeness) and maturity in holiness.

Our Lord Jesus Christ will accomplish the will of God. He is powerful and faithful!

Whole - not fragmented, not separate from each other. You can however gaze through a particular lens / angle.

Body - public, visible, tangible presence

Soul - conscience, self-awareness, memory and imagination

Spirit - interior that is present and open to the Creator

The power of Jesus will bring restoration to the whole.

Each angle can experience rescue, redemption, and be re-directed.

Question: What is required of you and from you to experience wholeness? What parts of you need rescued? Are you willing to trust in the power and faithfulness of Jesus? Are you ready to put it all on the line?

vs. 25-26, Three requests

- 1. Pray for us (Paul and his co-workers).
- 2. Greet all the brothers and sisters with a holy kiss. Tangibly demonstrate the bond that is shared between the family of God.

1 Peter 5:14 Greet one another with a kiss of love. Peace to all of you who are in Christ.

Sharing the bond of love with one another (fellowship and friendship)

3. Read this letter to all the brothers and sisters. Each one is responsible for the health of the church. All of us are to be engaged in unity, holiness, peace, and maturity.

vs. 28, Jesus is pouring out his favor and goodness onto the church.

Remember! Don't forget! Rely on one another!
