

# “Unshakable – Part 2”

**Hebrews 12:25-29 Amplified Bible:** <sup>25</sup> See to it that you do not refuse [to listen to] Him who is speaking [to you now]. For if those [sons of Israel] did not escape when they refused [to listen to] him who warned them on earth [revealing God’s will], how much less will we *escape* if we turn our backs on Him who warns from heaven? <sup>26</sup> His voice shook the earth [at Mount Sinai] then, but now He has given a promise, saying, “YET ONCE MORE I WILL SHAKE NOT ONLY THE EARTH, BUT ALSO THE [starry] HEAVEN.” <sup>27</sup> Now this [expression], “Yet once more,” indicates the removal *and* final transformation of all those things which can be shaken—that is, of that which has been created—so that those things which cannot be shaken may remain. <sup>28</sup> Therefore, since we receive a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us show gratitude, and offer to God pleasing service *and* acceptable worship with reverence and awe; <sup>29</sup> for our God is [indeed] a consuming fire.

\* Vs 25...**Refuse** means ‘to decline from obeying Him and His Word; to turn or fall away from and purposely reject His will.’

1. Does the Bible actually tell us that Christians will turn away from God or fall away from faith in God before the return of Jesus?

\***Jesus said: Matthew 24:10-13 Passion Translation:** <sup>10</sup> Then many will stop following me and fall away, and they will betray one another and hate one another. <sup>11</sup> And many lying prophets will arise, deceiving multitudes and leading them away from the path of truth. <sup>12</sup> There will be such an increase of sin and lawlessness that those whose hearts once burned with passion for God and others will grow cold. <sup>13</sup> But keep your hope to the end and you will experience life and deliverance.

\***Apostle Paul said: 1 Timothy 4:1 NKJV:** Now the Spirit expressly says that in latter times some will depart from the faith, giving heed to deceiving spirits and doctrines of demons,

**What are deceiving spirits and doctrines of demons?** Anyone that tries to get you to do anything that is in opposition to God’s Word. Any suggestions, persuasions, or teachings that are contrary to or contradicts the Word of God. The twisting of Scripture and taking God’s Word out of context. Teaching of parts of the Bible and not the whole counsel of God.

**Genesis 3:1-11 NKJV:** Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the Lord God had made. And he said to the woman, “Has God indeed said, ‘You shall not eat of every tree of the garden’?”

<sup>2</sup> And the woman said to the serpent, “We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden; <sup>3</sup> but of the fruit of the tree which *is* in the midst of the garden, God has said, ‘You shall not eat it, nor shall you touch it, lest you die.’ ”

<sup>4</sup> Then the serpent said to the woman, “You will not surely die. <sup>5</sup> For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.”

<sup>6</sup> So when the woman saw that the tree *was* good for food, that it *was* pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make *one* wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave

to her husband with her, and he ate. <sup>7</sup> Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they *were* naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings.

<sup>8</sup> And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden.

<sup>9</sup> Then the Lord God called to Adam and said to him, “Where *are* you?”

<sup>10</sup> So he said, “I heard Your voice in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself.”

<sup>11</sup> And He said, “Who told you that you *were* naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you that you should not eat?”

Sin disguises itself as something attractive, refreshing, rewarding. But underneath the false and deceptive exterior, sin is filthy and foul, it always leads to destruction and eventually death, and those who sport with it know only regret.

**Revelation 2:6,12-16 NKJV:** <sup>6</sup> But this you have, that you hate the deeds of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.

<sup>12</sup> “And to the angel of the church in Pergamos write, ‘These things says He who has the sharp two-edged sword: <sup>13</sup> “I know your works, and where you dwell, where Satan’s throne *is*. And you hold fast to My name, and did not deny My faith even in the days in which Antipas *was* My faithful martyr, who was killed among you, where Satan dwells. <sup>14</sup> But I have a few things against you, because you have there those who hold the doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed to idols, and to commit sexual immorality. <sup>15</sup> Thus you also have those who hold the doctrine of the Nicolaitans, which thing I hate. <sup>16</sup> Repent, or else I will come to you quickly and will fight against them with the sword of My mouth.

**1 Corinthians 6:9-20 NLT Study Bible:** <sup>9</sup> Don’t you realize that those who do wrong will not inherit the Kingdom of God? Don’t fool yourselves. Those who indulge in sexual sin, or who worship idols, or commit adultery, or are male prostitutes, or practice homosexuality, <sup>10</sup> or are thieves, or greedy people, or drunkards, or are abusive, or cheat people—none of these will inherit the Kingdom of God. <sup>11</sup> Some of you were once like that. But you were cleansed; you were made holy; you were made right with God by calling on the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

<sup>12</sup> You say, “I am allowed to do anything”—but not everything is good for you. And even though “I am allowed to do anything,” I must not become a slave to anything. <sup>13</sup> You say, “Food was made for the stomach, and the stomach for food.” (This is true, though someday God will do away with both of them.) But you can’t say that our bodies were made for sexual immorality. They were made for the Lord, and the Lord cares about our bodies. <sup>14</sup> And God will raise us from the dead by his power, just as he raised our Lord from the dead.

<sup>15</sup> Don’t you realize that your bodies are actually parts of Christ? Should a man take his body, which is part of Christ, and join it to a prostitute? Never! <sup>16</sup> And don’t you realize that if a man joins himself to a prostitute, he becomes one body with her? For the Scriptures

say, "The two are united into one." <sup>17</sup> But the person who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with him.

<sup>18</sup> Run from sexual sin! No other sin so clearly affects the body as this one does. For sexual immorality is a sin against your own body. <sup>19</sup> Don't you realize that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, who lives in you and was given to you by God? You do not belong to yourself, <sup>20</sup> for God bought you with a high price. So you must honor God with your body.

**Romans 6:15-23 NLT Study Bible:** <sup>15</sup> Well then, since God's grace has set us free from the law, does that mean we can go on sinning? Of course not! <sup>16</sup> Don't you realize that you become the slave of whatever you choose to obey? You can be a slave to sin, which leads to death, or you can choose to obey God, which leads to righteous living. <sup>17</sup> Thank God! Once you were slaves of sin, but now you wholeheartedly obey this teaching we have given you. <sup>18</sup> Now you are free from your slavery to sin, and you have become slaves to righteous living.

<sup>19</sup> Because of the weakness of your human nature, I am using the illustration of slavery to help you understand all this. Previously, you let yourselves be slaves to impurity and lawlessness, which led ever deeper into sin. Now you must give yourselves to be slaves to righteous living so that you will become holy.

<sup>20</sup> When you were slaves to sin, you were free from the obligation to do right. <sup>21</sup> And what was the result? You are now ashamed of the things you used to do, things that end in eternal doom. <sup>22</sup> But now you are free from the power of sin and have become slaves of God. Now you do those things that lead to holiness and result in eternal life. <sup>23</sup> For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord.

**Romans 12:1-2 NLT Study Bible:** And so, dear brothers and sisters I plead with you to give your bodies to God because of all he has done for you. Let them be a living and holy sacrifice—the kind he will find acceptable. This is truly the way to worship him. <sup>2</sup> Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect.

**2 Corinthians 11:13-15 NKJV:** <sup>13</sup> For such *are* false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into apostles of Christ. <sup>14</sup> And no wonder! For Satan himself transforms himself into an angel of light. <sup>15</sup> Therefore *it is* no great thing if his ministers also transform (disguise) themselves into ministers of righteousness, whose end will be according to their works (deeds and lifestyles.)

**Titus 1:15 - 2:1 Amplified Bible:** <sup>15</sup> To the pure, all things are pure; but to the corrupt and unbelieving, nothing is pure; both their mind and their conscience are corrupted. <sup>16</sup> They profess to know God [to recognize and be acquainted with Him], but by *their* actions they deny *and* disown Him. They are detestable and disobedient and worthless for good work of any kind.

But as for you, teach the things which are in agreement with sound doctrine [which produces men and women of good character whose lifestyle identifies them as true Christians].

**Proverbs 10:9 Amplified Bible:** He who walks in integrity *and* with moral character walks securely, but he who takes a crooked way will be discovered *and* punished.

**\*Jude said: Jude 1:3-4 Amplified Bible:** <sup>3</sup> Beloved, while I was making every effort to write you about our common salvation, I was compelled to write to you [urgently] appealing that you fight strenuously for [the defense of] the faith which was once for all handed down to the saints [the faith that is the sum of Christian belief that was given verbally to believers]. <sup>4</sup> For certain people have crept in unnoticed [just as if they were sneaking in by a side door]. They are ungodly persons whose condemnation was predicted long ago, for they distort the grace of our God into decadence *and* immoral freedom [viewing it as an opportunity to do whatever they want], and deny *and* disown our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ.

**\*What will Jesus say to people, who consistently live like this, when they stand before Him?**

**Matthew 7:21-23 NKJV:** <sup>21</sup> “Not everyone who says to Me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. <sup>22</sup> Many will say to Me in that day, ‘Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?’ <sup>23</sup> And then I will declare to them, ‘I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!’

2. We can build a Christian life so strong that it becomes unshakable!!

**Luke 6:46-49 Amplified Bible:** <sup>46</sup> “Why do you call Me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ and do not practice what I tell you? <sup>47</sup> Everyone who comes to Me and listens to My words and obeys them, I will show you whom he is like: <sup>48</sup> he is like a [far-sighted, practical, and sensible] man building a house, who dug deep and laid a foundation on the rock; and when a flood occurred, the torrent burst against that house and yet could not shake it, because it had been securely built *and* founded on the rock. <sup>49</sup> But the one who has [merely] heard and has not practiced [what I say], is like a [foolish] man who built a house on the ground without *any* foundation, and the torrent burst against it; and it immediately collapsed, and the ruin of that house was great.”

3. What is the foundation that we build our life upon and how do we become wise, skillful builders?

**1 Corinthians 3:10-15 Amplified:** <sup>10</sup> According to the [remarkable] grace of God which was given to me [to prepare me for my task], like a skillful master builder I laid a foundation, and now another is building on it. But each one must be careful how he builds on it, <sup>11</sup> for no one can lay a foundation other than the one which is [already] laid, which is Jesus Christ. <sup>12</sup> But if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, <sup>13</sup> each one's work will be clearly shown [for what it is]; for the day [of judgment] will disclose it, because it is to be revealed with fire, and the fire will test the quality *and* character *and* worth of each person's work. <sup>14</sup> If any person's work which he has built [on this foundation, that is, any outcome of his effort] remains [and survives this test], he will receive a reward. <sup>15</sup> But if any person's work is burned up [by the test], he will suffer the loss [of his reward]; yet he himself will be saved, but only as [one who has barely escaped] through fire.
