2 Corinthians 3:15-18

Yes, even today when they read Moses' writings, their hearts are covered with that veil, and they do not understand.¹⁶ But whenever someone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. ¹⁷ For the Lord is the Spirit, and wherever the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. ¹⁸ So all of us who have had that veil removed can see and reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord—who is the Spirit—makes us more and more like him as we are changed into his glorious image.



Monday, March 13th

2 Corinthians 3:15-18

Moses spent so much time in the presence of God that his face literally “shone” with God’s glory, causing him to cover his face with a veil (Exodus 34). When we come to know Jesus, God removes a different kind of “veil” so that we can fully comprehend God’s revelation to us. As we spend time with Christ, we grow in Christlikeness and reflect his glory. This doesn’t happen through glowing faces, as it did with Moses, but it shines through our character. We are transformed more into His likeness, and it makes us radiant and winsome in the way we relate to others.
