Hebrews 6:13-20

For example, there was God's promise to Abraham. Since there was no one greater to swear by, God took an oath in his own name, saying: 14 "I will certainly bless you, and I will multiply your descendants beyond number." [a] 15 Then Abraham waited patiently, and he received what God had promised. 16 Now when people take an oath, they call on someone greater than themselves to hold them to it. And without any question that oath is binding. 17 God also bound himself with an oath, so that those who received the promise could be perfectly sure that he would never change his mind. 18 So God has given both his promise and his oath. These two things are unchangeable because it is impossible for God to lie. Therefore, we who have fled to him for refuge can have great confidence as we hold to the hope that lies before us.



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This hope is a strong and trustworthy anchor for our souls. It leads us through the curtain into God's inner sanctuary. 20 Jesus has already gone in there for us. He has become our eternal High Priest in the order of Melchizedek.



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I see two words that stand out to me in this passage: anchor and hope. Christ provides us an anchor through the ups and downs of life to hold is fast to His love. That anchor gives us strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow.

“We have an anchor that keeps the soul
Steadfast and sure while the billows roll;
Fastened to the Rock which cannot
move,
Grounded firm and deep in the Savior’s
love!”

The hope of eternal life is provided to us by Christ’s crucifixion and His resurrection on Easter morning. Thank you, Jesus.
