Luke 22:24-30

Then they began to argue among themselves about who would be the greatest among them. **25** Jesus told them, “In this world the kings and great men lord it over their people, yet they are called ‘friends of the people.’ **26** But among you it will be different. Those who are the greatest among you should take the lowest rank, and the leader should be like a servant. **27** Who is more important, the one who sits at the table or the one who serves? The one who sits at the table, of course. But not here! For I am among you as one who serves. **28** “You have stayed with me in my time of trial. **29** And just as my Father has granted me a Kingdom, I now grant you the right **30** to eat and drink at my table in my Kingdom. And you will sit on thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel.



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The future is bright for those called of God. Jesus said that the faithful servant “will eat and drink at My table in My Kingdom.” To serve others here on earth is to serve our Lord as well. Jesus called attention to “the least of these” in Matthew 25:45. Our culture is about awards and recognition and places of honor while the followers of Christ are about the marginalized and neglected. It is “the least of these” Jesus calls “my brother and sisters.” It’s something to think about!
