## **BIG IDEA: God's deliverance can't be stopped**

### **1 - Exodus 13:17-22**

- God led the people out of Egypt and did so by leading with a pillar of cloud and a pillar of fire.
- Sometimes God detours us to defend us.
  - Has he done this in your life? How so?

**What are some ways God leads us today? Are there ways God is leading us today that you could use but currently aren't? What are those ways? Why aren't you using them?**

### **2 - Exodus 14:1-14**

- Pharaoh's heart is hardened again and the Egyptians chase after the Israelites.
- The Israelites see the Egyptians coming and they became fearful.
- The Israelites immediately cried out to God and say that they wanted to stay in Egypt in the first place. Which was not true. (Ex 2:23)

**Have you ever had a moment where you tell God one thing but then when faced with the circumstance you feel differently? What was the situation? Do you still react that way when you encounter situations? What does this teach us about God answering us when we ask?**

### **3- Exodus 14:15-20**

- How did God protect the Israelites despite their lack of faith?(v.19)
- What were the Israelites scared of?

**How can we see God is protecting us even when we lack faith? What are ways you lack faith? What is all lack of faith rooted in?**

### **4 - Exodus 14:21-31**

- God made a way when there was no way for the Israelites to escape their greatest problem.
- God literally split the sea in two(what was impossible) in order to make a way possible for the Israelites.
- Jesus does that ultimately for us on the cross. There was no way for us to be reconciled to God and God made a way for us by sending his Son.

**When you think about God parting the Red Sea, how does that remind you of your salvation? Do you often remember Jesus work on the cross? What are ways you can continually remind yourself of his sacrifice for us?**
