- 1. Why is it easier to talk about other's failures and not our own?
- 2. How are we actually more like Judas and Peter than Jesus?

BIG IDEA: Jesus is faithful for the unfaithful.

Read John 18:15-18

- 3. Peter denies Jesus. This happens only hours after he told Jesus he was willing to die for him. What can we learn from Peter about our own hearts?
- 4. What does verse 18 tell us about Peter?

Read John 18:19-21

- 5. Who is the high priest and what is his role?
- 6. How does Jesus answer Annas?

Read John 18:22-24

- 7. How is this a sham of a trial?
- 8. How is Jesus exposing the unfaithfulness of the high priest?
- 9. How is Jesus showing His faithfulness, and foreshadowing His coming death on the cross?

Read John 18:25

- 10. Peter denies Jesus again. He has not run toward Jesus but has distanced himself from him and failed again. What can we learn from this?
- 11. In other gospel accounts we learn that Peter actually swore he didn't know Jesus. How can this happen? How is John really putting a mirror before us and showing us a glimpse of ourselves?



Read John 18:26-27

- 12. The tension is building. Peter is feeling pulled in and he again denies Jesus. He is fearing man more than God. How is this like our sin?
- 13. From other gospel accounts we learn that Jesus turns and looks at Peter. How do you think He looked at Peter?
- 14. How can this help us, as we think of how Jesus looks at us in our sin?
- 15. How can we know we are forgiven?
