2. How do the claims of Jesus fit in this category? What are some of them?

3. What is the background to the scene in chapter 14?

Read John 14:1-6

4. What does Jesus mean when He says, “Let not your hearts be troubled”?
5. Does Jesus ultimately tell them everything will be okay?
6. What is the point of this passage?
7. What are some truths about storms in life?
8. What encouragement and comfort do you get from this passage?
9. What do you think about Thomas’ question? How should we view his statements and questions?
10. Why would it be a good idea to strive to be like Thomas?
11. Why is it actually “unloving” to not share the truths from verse 6 with those who are lost?

12. Jesus is constantly claiming to be God. What truths do we learn in these verses?
