- 4. How does knowing that Jesus suffered, make pain and suffering more bearable?
- 5. Read Hebrews 4:14-16. What do these verses urge us to do in our suffering?
- 6. How does knowing Jesus lived as a man, suffered and was tempted as we are, make any difference in the pain we experience?
- 7. Is it okay to be vulnerable, to not have answers, to weep and mourn? Why?
- 8. Have you had anything in your life that has caused you to say "God if you loved me you would have... (fill in the blank)?
- 9. How does your understanding of God's Word help you now better understand how to respond to tough situations?
- 10. Talk about how we can better trust Christ in the midst of pain? How do we prepare ourselves to do this well and to help others?
- 11. What are some of the truths and promises of God we see in Psalm 22:1-11?
- 12. Practically, how do we cling to God's promises?
