Church School Lesson: Lesson Text: "Freedom to Edify" 1st Corinthians 10:23-11:1 Key Text: "I have the right to do anything: -but not everything is constructive." 1st Corinthians 10:23b

Summary of the Lesson: - Corinth was an ancient Greek city with rich historical and cultural legacy. Part of this legacy was numerous temples to the various Greek gods., the most dominant being the temples to Apollo, the god of wisdom, and to Aphrodite, the goddess of love. These two temples seem to have captured the spirit of Corinth, because, like Apollo, the Corinthians placed a high priority on the pursuit of wisdom, and, like Aphrodite, they place a high priority on the pursuit of "love". In fact, Corinth had become so intimately connected with ritual prostitution that the Greek verb "to corinthianize" meant "to engage in sexual relations". The Corinthians' love of learning and loving helps explain Paul's focus in his letters on what constitutes true wisdom and love. Paul argues that true wisdom comes not from studying philosophy or religion but from knowing Gd. Read 1 Corinthians 13: 4-8 for Paul's definition lo love. The believers in Corinth were surrounded by all kinds of ideas and practices contrary to God and His purpose and plans. The believers had the freedom through the work of Christ on the cross. But, this freedom was not to be used to justify certain behavior. There are important considerations to be made. The freedom in Christ allows the believer to not have to adhere to the Law of Moses, or any tradition, man-made command beyond what God requires. Verse 23 says "I have the right to do anything, but not everything is beneficial. I have the right to do anything, but not everything is beneficial." The idea here is that the believer has to consider how his/her actions/behavior impacts other believers whose spiritual maturity is at risk. The example in verse 27 indicates while the believer who chooses to have a meal at an unbeliever's house, he/she is free in Christ to eat whatever is being served. Conversely, if the believer is told that the meal being served has been offered as part of idol ritual/sacrifice, then the believer is not to eat whatever that is. Certainly, idol worship, Jewish dietary and circumcision requirements, philosophical teachings infiltrating the church at Corinth was of concern to Paul. The same concern regarding outside of God influences exists for believers today. We are bombarded daily with all kind of influences that are potentially damaging to our spiritual health: social media platforms; places and things that those who see us come to associate with us when they see us; places and things that work against holiness. We have to be mindful of how what we do, or participate in, affect the openness to receive the Gospel Message of those who observe us. The key word in the title of the lesson is "edify". That word means to make better; to uplift; to build up. The freedom we have in Christ is not meant to be selfish or self-centered. What this means is that we are to share our faith with others; to make the people we meet better. It does not mean that we will win every person we meet. What it does mean is that we can, perhaps, add brightness to their lives because we bring something of the spirit and character of Christ into their lives. It means that even though we are in the world, we are to live with a sense of duty to honor and glorify God and be a witness to others. This freedom means that our thoughts, words, and deeds are anchored in personal holiness. It does not mean that we lower our standards or that we become "holier than thou" or become hypocritical. It does mean that we are to be determined to be like the One above who made us better – our future in eternity depends on it. Freedom in Christ liberates us from slavery to sin. In the world freedom is often misunderstood and abused. As believers, we are to represent our freedom in Christ in a way that honors God and edifies others. Amen.


