

Summary of the Lesson: The lesson is not only about faith and human relationship but also about how God works amid our circumstance. The Book of Ruth focuses on the life experiences of one family during the period of the judges, who overcome extreme hardship to become an influential member of ancient Israelite society. It was a wild time for the Israelites during the period of the judges. The people began to engage in the forbidden practices of their neighbors, including worshipping other gods. As punishment, God raised up various nations from among Israel's neighbors, who harass and oppress them. When the people repented and asked for help, God sent deliverers known as judges, who initiated a period of peace. But the peace was short-lived, as Israel again turned, time and time again, from God. What we know from the verses before our lesson text begins is that Bethlehem experienced a great famine. The story of Ruth begins with the departure of a family leaving Bethlehem in search of greener pastures. The characters are Naomi, husband Elimelech and two sons. They went to Moab and settled there. The husband died, leaving the two sons who married Moabite women. Eventually, the sons died. Naomi, Ruth and Orpah became widows. The lesson text begins with Naomi learning of God's provision in her homeland. For her, the journey back was a return to her family and the safety net it represented. But what about the Moabite women? The three women had suffered tremendous grief and loss. Would they choose to go with her? Both women started out with Naomi but only one continued -Ruth. Let's stop here and consider what motivates you to leave your comfort zone. What is the cost of moving forward; going into the unknown; and at what risks? There were two daughters-in-law, but only Ruth made the decision to travel with Naomi. She made the decision to leave her home and her gods behind. What did she see in Naomi? How did she come to trust Naomi so? Perhaps over the period Ruth spent with Naomi it was the conversations about Naomi's God; and the love Naomi had for her daughters-in-law. The relationship one has with God is very important. I want to suggest, however, that it is also important to seek wise counsel from someone who may be older, more experienced, and wiser regarding life. It pays to engage in some inquiry from those who have had the experience of both success and failure in the journey of life before making decisions and taking actions that can have long lasting consequences. When we face decisions in life, it is wise for us to do some spiritual inquiry rather than just proceeding with only our human insight, and the primary means through which God communicates to us is through His Holy Word. Seeking and applying Godly wisdom gained from His Word and wise counsel from spiritually mature people results in peace in the decisions we face. The faith that Ruth had was big enough to step out of her comfort zone; step into the unknown; take the risk and bear the consequence of leaving all she knew behind. By the way, God had a hand in all of it. It reminds me that God works for the good of those who love Him. You know the rest of this beautiful story; of Ruth's faithfulness to God and to Naomi; living in a community with God and others. Ruth is a story of heartbreak, loyalty, love, and the hardship of poverty. It is also about love that crosses cultural and ethnic lines. Living amid pain and suffering is difficult, especially if we are dealing with our own feelings of loss. How you respond to tragedy will determine whether we can follow Ruth's example as she followed God's example without even knowing her many-times great grandson, Jesus Christ. Can we demonstrate love in our relationships like Ruth? Amen.


