3. Why is it hard to relate in love, humility, and unity with people who are unlike us in God's family? How does remembering that we are all sinners in need of a Savior change that? (3:28)
4. Why does relating to brothers and sisters in Christ across all differences most powerfully display the gospel? Why does this take intentional effort and dependence on the Holy Spirit? (3:28)
5. Do the relationships you keep and the way you spend your time and money reflect that you "belong to Christ?" If not, what needs to change and what step can you take this week toward that change? (3:29)
