SCRIPTURE READING

Acts 4:32-5:16; Acts 2:42-47; Deuteronomy 15:4-11; Joshua 7:1-26; Psalm 133:1-3;

Isaiah 61:1-3; Romans 12:3-13:10

STUDY QUESTIONS

1. In what ways are you most tempted to live independently of God or others? What risks do we take when we depend on one another?
2. What is the relationship between the gospel and sharing our life with one another? In what ways do we often insulate ourselves from biblical interdependence, individually, as a church, or as a society? (4:32-37)
3. Why does God discipline us? What is lost when we keep our life for ourselves and act on our own accord, not one accord? (5:1-11)
4. How does sharing our life with one another lead to multiplication of God's mission? What is one way your community group can regularly live on mission together? (5:12-16)
5. Did anyone in your community group have an opportunity to share the gospel this week? If so, describe how it went. If not, who could you share the gospel with this coming week? (5:14)
6. What "size" of the gospel in this week's sermon is hardest for you to live out? Which one comes easiest for you? Which one is easiest for your community group? How could the Lord use your group to bring the gospel to your community through a whole-life gospel witness?
