SCRIPTURE READING

Philippians 1:1-11; Philippians 2:14-16; 4:1; 1 Thessalonians 2:17-20; Ephesians 1:15-23; 3:14-21; Colossians 1:9-14; 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13; 2 Thessalonians 1:3-12

STUDY QUESTIONS

1. Who is your disciple or mentee (1:1)? How are you living as a “bond-servant” of Christ? How often do you remind yourself of your position and identity in Him (1:1-2)?
2. What is the link between gratitude and joy (1:3-4)? How can you give thanks to God in every situation (1:3)? Why should joy be central to your prayer life (1:4)? What circumstances make it hard for you to rejoice, and how can you grow in expressing gratitude to others?
3. How do you actively partner with CBC (1:5-7)? How are you investing your time, talents, and resources? How do you decide where to give and serve? Which acts of giving and service have been most meaningful to you?
4. How has God sustained CBC’s mission and your ministry fruitfulness (1:6)? What is CBC doing now to increase its kingdom impact? What part of your life needs attention before Christ returns? How can you use Philippians 1:6 to encourage fellow believers?
5. How can you grow in love for other believers at CBC (1:9a)? How do biblical knowledge and discernment strengthen that love (1:9b)? How do these qualities prepare us for Christ’s judgment seat (1:10)? What would help CBC to be “filled with the fruit of righteousness” (1:11)?
