## **Study Questions**

- 1. How concerned are you for the spiritual well-being of the believers you serve (11:2)? In what specific ways do you exercise a "godly jealousy"?
- 2. How has Satan deceived you in the past (11:3, 13–15)? In what way is he currently tempting you? How can you resist him? Who can help you in your battle?
- 3. What are the essentials of Jesus, the Spirit, and the gospel (11:4)? When can unity be stretched too far? What are examples of false gospels today? Why are they attractive? In what ways are you tempted to turn to "another Jesus"?
- 4. How can you become simpler and clearer in your speech (11:5–6)? How do you evaluate teachers and preachers? Which do you regard more highly: content or style of communication? How will you strive to prioritize the former? What is your motivation for serving (11:7–9)? What are some impure motivations you battle? How can you serve for the right reasons? Read 1 Corinthians 4:1–5.
- 5. Why do we often push away the ones who love us most (11:11)? How have you disregarded those who have attempted to invest in you? To whom do you need to reaffirm your appreciation and loyalty?
