SCRIPTURE READING

1 Kings 17:1-16; 1 Kings 16:29-34; 1 Kings 8:35-36; Deuteronomy 28:22-24;

James 5:17-18; Daniel 9:1-19; Luke 4:25-30

STUDY QUESTIONS

- 1. When have you claimed a specific biblical promise in your own life (17:1b)? When have you directly shared a biblical promise with someone else? How well do you know what God says in His Word? What can you do to gain a deeper understanding of Scripture?
- 2. How have you responded when God asked you to trust Him during hard times (17:2-3)? What is the value of spending time alone with God? Have you ever had that experience? What was it like? What commitments have you made to spend quality time alone with God?
- 3. When have you trusted God's provision during uncertain or scarce circumstances (17:4-6, 7-16)? How has God provided in surprising ways in the past? Where do you tend to rely on yourself instead of God? How do you stay hopeful and obedient while waiting on God? How can you build daily trust in God's timing and faithfulness?
- 4. What area in your life is God asking you to trust Him even when it doesn't make logical sense (17:7–16)? What does obedience look like for you right now, even if the outcome is unknown? How does God's past faithfulness help you trust that He will continue to sustain you?
- 5. When was the last time you gave out of your need, not your abundance (17:15)? How open are you to helping others when your own situation feels insecure or uncertain? How does the widow's story challenge your mindset about generosity and trust?
