Study Questions

- 1. As a wife, in what specific ways are you submissive to your husband (1 Peter 3:1a)? Would your husband say that you are generally "submissive"? Why or why not? How has God used your behavior to spiritually influence your husband (3:1b–2)? What improvements in your character has your husband noted in the past 12 months?
- 2. How much time do you spend on your physical appearance versus your spiritual growth (1 Peter 3:3–4)? Are you more beautiful outside or inside? How would your husband or friends answer this question? Would those who know you best indicate that you have a "gentle and quiet spirit"? What steps can you take this week to cultivate this type of spirit?
- 3. What Old Testament women do you look up to (1 Peter 3:5–6)? Why are these women so impressive to you? What can you learn from their successes and failures? Who are some contemporary women you look up to? What character qualities do these women possess? Is there a woman who you deeply respect that you can ask to mentor you in a Titus 2:3–5 type relationship?
- 4. As a husband, how have you lived with your wife in an "understanding way" (1 Peter 3:7)? Give concrete examples. How have you failed in this area? How have you honored your wife? What can you do to grow in these areas? Will you contact a godly husband that you look up to this week and ask for prayer and direction? In what ways have your prayers been hindered when you have been out of fellowship with your wife?
- 5. What threatens to disturb the harmony of your CBC relationships (1 Peter 3:8)? How can you work diligently to promote harmony within the body? How do you presently demonstrate love, sympathy, and compassion to CBC members? How have you sinned against others in your speech in the past six months (3:9–12)? Is there anyone of whom you need to ask forgiveness?

•	"In the same way" (3:1a) refers to the previous context (cf. 2:13–20). True False	
•	"Behavior" and "observe" (3:1–2) ties back to	
•	"Respectful/reverent" (3:2) is <i>primarily</i> in reference to husbands. True False	
•	"Adornment/beauty" (3:3) is the Greek word <i>kosmos</i> , which means	
•	"Imperishable" (3:4) is used of our eternal inheritance and being born((1:4, 23).
•	"A gentle and quiet spirit" (3:4) is only required of wives. True False	
•	Sarah called Abraham "" (3:6) as a sign of respect.	
•	"Without being frightened by any fear" (3:6) is an allusion to	3:25–26.
