Sermon Application Review from Mark 14:1-11

How did you celebrate the cross as God's great Passover (14:1-2, 10-11)? What practical step did you take to grow as a worshiper of Jesus (14:3-9)? How did this passage change your view of the cross?

Study Questions

- 1. How have you struggled with doubt about God or your faith (20:24-25)? What makes it hard for you to trust in Jesus' person or work?
- 2. How would your heart and life change if you saw Jesus in a personal, undeniable way (20:26-27)? When has Jesus met you at your lowest point? How are you comforted by the knowledge that Jesus isn't afraid of your questions and doubts?
- 3. What does it mean for you personally to say, "My Lord and my God" (20:28)? How can you make this declaration a part of your daily actions and decisions? How can your doubts be transformed into worship or a deeper relationship with Jesus?
- 4. What does it mean to believe without seeing (20:29)? How does this apply to your life today, especially when you can't physically see Jesus? Why is it important to rely on faith, not just evidence?
- 5. Is anyone in your life (e.g., a friend, classmate, or family member) struggling with doubt or disbelief in Jesus? How can you support and encourage them? What can you do to help them move from doubt to faith?
