Holistic health and holistic life are a part of His abundant life for us.

"Holism" is the theory that whole entities, as fundamental components of reality, have an existence other than as the mere sum total of their parts. "Holism" refers to the health of the entire person – Spirit, Soul, Body.

God purchases and redeems us so that He may possess us.

We are being filled with "spiritual riches" to the degree we are employed in His Kingdom service.

The chief way you and I can be disloyal to God is to make small what He intended to make large.

"Holistic" stewardship is the absolute surrender of all that I am (spirit, soul, body) to His purpose for my life.

Closely aligned to commitment is "consecration," which means to "fill the hands." When we "consecrate" our lives to Him, we put into His hands everything we are. We fill His hands with us

When you become fully "Kingdom employable," God is the nerve center of every arena of your life. He becomes the pivotal point in the details of your everyday life.

You are never "whole" as a person until you invest, surrender the sum total of your parts – spirit, soul, body – all that you are and can be to God.

There is no road too long, no task too difficult, no load too heavy when one has passed through the door of personal consecration.
