"The Angel of the Lord appeared to him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush; and he looked, and behold, the bush burned with fire, yet was not consumed. And Moses said, 'I will now turn aside and see this great sight, why the bush is not burned.' And when the Lord saw that he turned aside to see, God called to him out of the midst of the bush and said, 'Moses, Moses!' And he said, 'Here am I.' "God said, 'I will surely be with you; and this shall be the sign to you that I have sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain [Horeb, or Sinai]." -Exodus 3:12 (AMPC)

In Egypt, God delivered Israel out of bondage into worship – because through worshipping Him, they would come to know the heart and nature of the One Who promised: Exodus 3:12, 17 (AMPC) – "God said, 'I will surely be with you; and this shall be the sign to you that I have sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall serve God on this mountain [Horeb, or Sinai].' 'And I have declared that I will bring you up out of the affliction of Egypt…to a land flowing with milk and honey.""

God is saying to Moses (and to the children of Israel) that worship is His purpose for them and His key to their destiny.

We are called to liberty and to intimacy with Him.

His objective in liberating them, vanquishing the Egyptians, and bringing them to Sinai, is to establish a special relationship: "I brought you unto Myself...you shall be a special treasure to Me."

Today, as then, worship brings into our midst a manifestation of Kingdom authority which will energize our life and expand our spiritual horizons.
