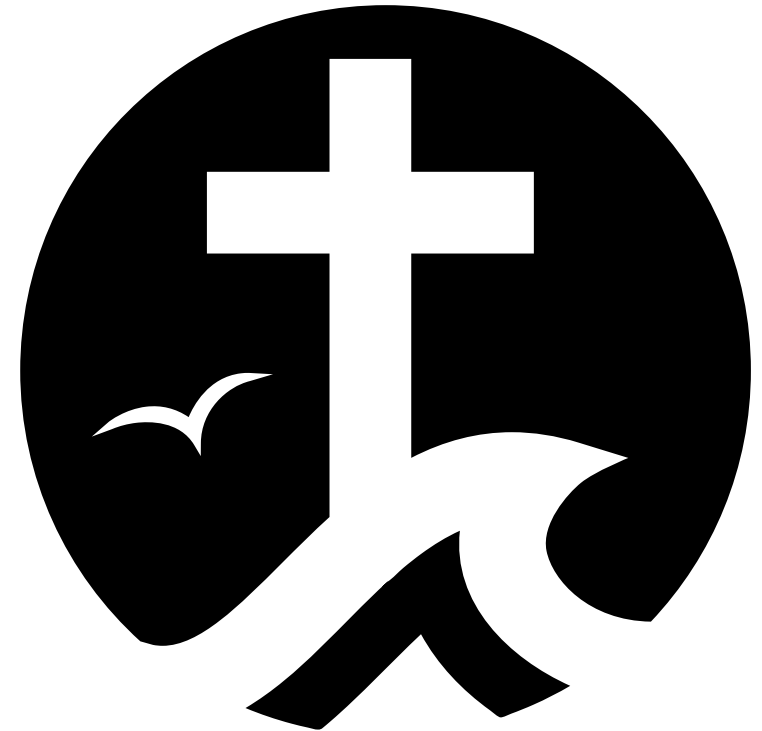

Jonah; God's Grace on Display

A Crisis of Faith

1. God commands us to go with Him as Witnesses of His Word.

"The word of the Lord came to Jonah son of Amittai"^{2Kings14:25}.

"Get up! Go to the great city of Nineveh and preach against it because their evil has come up before me." *Jonah 1:1-2 (CSB)*

"The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. We observed his glory, the glory as the one and only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."
John 1:14 (CSB)

"Jesus came near and said to them, "All authority has been given to me in heaven and on earth. ¹⁹Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
Matthew 28:18-20 (CSB)

2. Disobedience drives us away from God and toward despair.

"Jonah got up to flee to Tarshish from the Lord's presence. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. He paid the fare and went down into it to go with them to Tarshish from the Lord's presence. ⁴But the Lord threw a great wind onto the sea, and such a great storm arose on the sea that the ship threatened to break apart. ⁵The sailors were afraid, and each cried out to his god. They threw the ship's cargo into the sea to lighten the load. Meanwhile, Jonah had gone down to the lowest part of the vessel and had stretched out and fallen into a deep sleep."
Jonah 1:3-5 (CSB)

"As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up, knelt down before him, and asked him, "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" ¹⁸"Why do you call me good?" Jesus asked him. "No one is good except God alone. ¹⁹You know the commandments: Do not murder; do not commit adultery; do not steal; do not bear false witness; do not defraud; honor your father and mother."²⁰ He said to him, "Teacher, I have kept all these

from my youth." ²¹ Looking at him, Jesus loved him and said to him, "You lack one thing: Go, sell all you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." ²² But he was dismayed by this demand, and he went away grieving, because he had many possessions." *Mark 10:17-22 (CSB)*

3. Our lack of faith doesn't change God's faithfulness.

"The captain approached him and said, "What are you doing sound asleep? Get up! Call to your god: Maybe this god will consider us, and we won't perish." ⁷"Come on!" the sailors said to each other. "Let's cast lots. Then we'll know who is to blame for this trouble we're in." So they cast lots, and the lot singled out Jonah. ⁸Then they said to him, "Tell us who is to blame for this trouble we're in. What is your business, and where are you from? What is your country, and what people are you from?" ⁹He answered them, "I'm a Hebrew. I worship the LORD, the God of the heavens, who made the sea and the dry land." ¹⁰Then the men were seized by a great fear and said to him, "What have you done?" The men knew he was fleeing from the Lord's presence because he had told them. ¹¹ So they said to him, "What should we do to you so that the sea will calm down for us?" For the sea was getting worse and worse. ¹²He answered them, "Pick me up and throw me into the sea so that it will calm down for you, for I know that I'm to blame for this great storm that is against you." ¹³Nevertheless, the men rowed hard to get back to dry land, but they couldn't because the sea was raging against them more and more. ¹⁴ So they called out to the LORD, "Please, LORD, don't let us perish because of this man's life, and don't charge us with innocent blood! For you, LORD, have done just as you pleased." ¹⁵Then they picked up Jonah and threw him into the sea, and the sea stopped its raging. ¹⁶ The men were seized by great fear of the Lord, and they offered a sacrifice to the LORD and made vows."
