Small Group Questions and Resources

*Please keep in mind that small groups are not expected to get through all of these questions. They are not required to "get through" any of them. Rather, please take these questions as an optional guide to help digest the message.

1. Have you ever been shaken by something you heard in a sermon or from an influencer? What is the difference between being quickly shaken and being disturbed? Have you ever heard a false teacher or prophet make claims that you knew were wrong or anti-biblical, but there were people being taken in? How did you react? How can we interject in such situations in a God-honoring way?
2. How is Paul's description of the apostasy supposed to help comfort the Thessalonians? Doesn't it seem calculated to do exactly the opposite? How does this relate to Christ's teaching in Matthew 24? How is this almost the opposite of the concern they had over those who had died in Christ before His return?
3. When we look at the man of lawlessness, what are some of the big take-aways? What is he going to be like? What are the worst of his traits? What does it mean that he will perform miracles, but miracles that will be deception and false? How can a miracle or wonder be false?
4. What does it mean that there have been many antichrists as in 1 John 2:18? What are some of the historical examples that we see? Why do we have to be careful about looking for "the antichrist" in contemporary settings? Why are we also wise at the same time to pay attention?
