When they talked about the distance, their pastor encouraged them to plant a new church.

So they did, in 2021. Other Puerto Rican Baptist pastors pitched in and our North American Mission Board provided training and support. These days the church sends out witnessing teams to introduce locals to Jesus and the new church. Church teams have also been busy helping rebuild homes damaged or destroyed by Hurricane Maria.

The area around Villalba suffered heavy damage from the high winds and mudslides. Roy has found that many locals are senior citizens; many of them lived in the United States but returned here to retire. Let's pray their church will grow and impact their entire city.
