

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOU CAUSE A STORM!

Jonah – Pt 1 Pastor Craig Coulter

...Each one of us should be careful how we build our lives. The only true foundation for building is Jesus Christ. But be careful in choosing what building materials you use on that foundation. You can build with values that last forever like gold, silver and jewels or can build with values that burn up and won't last like wood, hay, and straw. One day your work on earth will be inspected on the Day of Judgment. God will test it by fire, so the quality of your work is MANIFESTED and all will see the true value of what you accomplished. If your work survives the fire, you will receive your reward. But if your work is burned up, you will lose your reward, even though you yourself will be saved, like someone barely escaping a fire. (1 Corinthians 3:10-14)

TEN LESSONS FROM JONAH ABOUT MY LIFE MISSION

JONAH 1:1-17

1. MY LIFE MISSION WILL COME FROM GOD'S WORD.

One day, God spoke his Word to Jonah, the son of Amittai. (Jonah 1:1)

2. MY LIFE MISSION WILL REQUIRE A STEP OF FAITH.

"I want you to get up and go to the great city of Nineveh..." (Jonah 1:2a)

3. MY LIFE MISSION WILL SOMEHOW HELP OTHERS.

"...go to the great city of Nineveh and <u>tell them</u> that I see all the evil happening there and <u>I won't ignore it</u>." (Jonah 1:2b)

4. MY LIFE MISSION MAY SCARE ME AT FIRST.

But Jonah <u>ran away</u> from the presence of the Lord. (Jonah 1:3a)

5. RUNNING ... CAUSES BAD CONSEQUENCES.

a) IF I RUN FROM GOD MY LIFE WILL GO DOWNHILL.

He went <u>DOWN</u> to Joppa, where <u>he found</u> a ship headed for the port of Tarshish. He paid the price to sail to Tarshish, and went <u>DOWN</u> below deck, <u>hoping to get as far away from God as he could get</u>. (Jonah 1:3b)

Jonah was <u>DOWN below laying DOWN</u> sound asleep. (Jonah 1:5)

(later) "I sank DOWN, DOWN into the deep sea!" (Jonah 2:3 NCV) "I was as FAR DOWN as a body can go!" (Jonah 2:6 MSG)

b) IF I RUN FROM GOD, IT WILL COST ME.

He paid the price to sail to Tarshish. (Jonah 1:3b)

c) IF I RUN FROM GOD, GOD WILL <u>OPPOSE ME</u>.

But as the ship was sailing, the Lord sent <u>an opposing wind</u>... (Jonah 1:4a)

d) IF I RUN FROM GOD, OTHER PEOPLE WILL GET HURT TOO.

...the opposing wind <u>created such a massive storm</u> that the ship was in danger of breaking apart! (Jonah 1:4b)

All the sailors were <u>terrified</u>, and they cried out in <u>desperation</u> to whatever gods each one trusted. They also <u>threw overboard everything they could</u> to lighten the ship's load. While this storm was <u>threatening everyone</u>, Jonah was down below deck laying down sound asleep. (Jonah 1:5)

So they asked Jonah "How have you brought down all this trouble on us?" (Jonah 1:8a)

6. THE LONGER I RUN FROM GOD; THE WORSE IT GETS.

Now the storm was <u>GETTING WORSE</u>, and the waves <u>GOT ROUGHER</u>, so again they asked Jonah, "What should we <u>do to you to stop the storm</u> and calm everything down?" (Jonah 1:11)

"Throw me overboard down into the sea," Jonah said, "and <u>everything will calm down</u>. I know that it is my fault that you're having to fight this terrible storm." (Jonah 1:12)

7. IF I'M FIGHTING GOD'S PLAN, TRYING HARDER <u>DOESN'T WORK</u>.

Instead, the sailors <u>tried harder</u> to row the ship back to land and safety. But <u>they could not turn it</u> <u>around</u>, for the raging storm was <u>out of control</u>. (Jonah 1:13)

8. WHEN I DO WHAT GOD WANTS, THINGS WILL CALM DOWN.

Finally, the <u>sailors cried out to Jonah's God</u> "O Lord, don't let us die because of this man's life! And please don't hold us responsible for his death, because you, Lord, <u>sent this storm for your purpose</u>." Then they took Jonah and threw him overboard, and <u>immediately the raging sea calmed down</u>. (Jonah 1:14-15)

9. WHEN I DO WHAT GOD WANTS, UNBELIEVERS BELIEVE.

When the sailors saw this happen, they were <u>awestruck</u> by God's greatness, and they worshiped God. They offered a sacrifice and <u>made vows</u> to God. (Jonah 1:16)

10. WHEN I ACCEPT MY MISSION, GOD SHOWS ME MERCY!

Now the Lord PREPARED a great fish to <u>swallow up</u> Jonah, and Jonah was inside that great fish for three days and nights. (Jonah 1:17)
