²⁷ Great crowds trailed along behind him, including many grief-stricken women. ²⁸ But Jesus turned and said to them, "Daughters of Jerusalem, don't weep for me, but weep for yourselves…" ³² Two others, both criminals, were led out to be executed with him. ³³ Finally, they came to a place called The Skull. All three were crucified there -- Jesus on the center cross, and the two criminals on either side. ³⁴ Then Jesus said, "FATHER FORGIVE THEM, for they do not know what they are doing." And the soldiers gambled for his clothes by throwing dice. ³⁵ As the crowd stood watching, the leaders laughed and scoffed at Jesus. "He saved others," they said, "let him save himself if he really is God's Chosen One, the Messiah." ³⁶ The soldiers mocked him, too, and offered him a drink of sour wine. ³⁷ They called out to him, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" (Luke 23:27-28, 32-37 NLT)

WHAT WE USUALLY DO WITH GUILT

1. WE BURY IT.

When I refused to confess my sin, I was weak and miserable, and I groaned all day long... My strength evaporated like water in the summer heat. Finally, I confessed all my sins to you and stopped trying to hide them. I said to myself, "I will confess my rebellion to the Lord." And you forgave me! All my guilt is gone. (Psalm 32:3-5 NLT)

You will never succeed in life if you try to hide your sins. (Proverbs 28:13 GN)

2. WE BLAME OTHERS.

"Yes," Adam admitted, "<u>but</u> it was <u>the woman you gave me</u> who brought me some, and I ate it." (Genesis 3:12 LB)

Some people ruin themselves by their own stupid actions and then blame the Lord. (Proverbs 19:3 GN)

3. WE BEAT OURSELVES UP.

My guilt has overwhelmed me; like a load it weighs me down...because I was foolish, I am bent over and bowed down; I am sad all day long. (Psalm 38:4-6 NCV)

WHAT JESUS WANTS US TO DO WITH GUILT

1. ADMIT IT.

The Lord gave us a mind and a conscience. We cannot hide from ourselves. (Proverbs 20:27 GN)

Let us <u>examine</u> our ways and <u>test them</u>... (Lamentations 3:40 NIV)

2. ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY.

I recognize my faults. I am conscious of my sins... (Psalm 51:3 GN)

Admit your faults to one another and pray for each other so that you may be <u>healed</u>. (James 5:16 LB)

3. ASK FOR FORGIVENESS.

If we freely admit that we have sinned, we find God utterly reliable...<u>he forgives our sins</u> and makes us <u>thoroughly clean</u> from all that is evil. (1 John 1:9 Ph)

All of us have sinned... yet <u>God declares us "not guilty</u>" IF we trust in Jesus Christ, who in mercy <u>freely</u> takes away our sins. (Romans 3:23-24 LB)

WHAT JESUS DOES WITH MY GUILT

• HE FORGIVES INSTANTLY.

God is merciful and <u>quick to forgive</u>. (Isaiah 55:7 GN)

• HE FORGIVES COMPLETELY.

He has forgiven ALL your sins. He has utterly <u>wiped out</u> the evidence of broken commandments which always hung over our heads, and has <u>completely annulled it</u> by nailing it to the cross! (Colossians 2:13-14 Ph)

HE FORGIVES FREELY.

For by the sacrificial death of Christ we are SET FREE, that is, our <u>sins are forgiven</u>. How great is the <u>GRACE</u> of God! (Ephesians 1:7 GN)

What <u>happiness</u> for those whose guilt has been forgiven!... <u>What relief</u> for those who... <u>God has cleared their record!</u> (Psalm 32:1-2 LB)
