Questions for Sunday, January 11th, 2025

- 1- How does Paul's transformation from persecutor to prisoner for Christ challenge our understanding of God's grace and ability to redirect our lives?
- 2- In what ways does living a life 'worthy of the calling' require more than personal piety, and how should it manifest in our relationships and community?
- 3- If faith should naturally lead to suffering and persecution, how do we reconcile comfort and ease in our Canadian context with the biblical expectation of costly discipleship?
- 4- Paul writes from prison yet encourages others—what does this teach us about using our current circumstances, however difficult, to glorify God rather than waiting for better conditions?
- 5- How can we distinguish between genuine faith that produces good works and a works-based righteousness that seeks to earn salvation?
- 6- In what ways might humility, gentleness, and patience be more challenging virtues to practice than bold proclamation, and why are they essential to walking worthy? Do you most need to experience more fully this year?
- 7- If the Holy Spirit's mission is to glorify Jesus, how should this shape our corporate worship, preaching, and ministry priorities as a church?
