

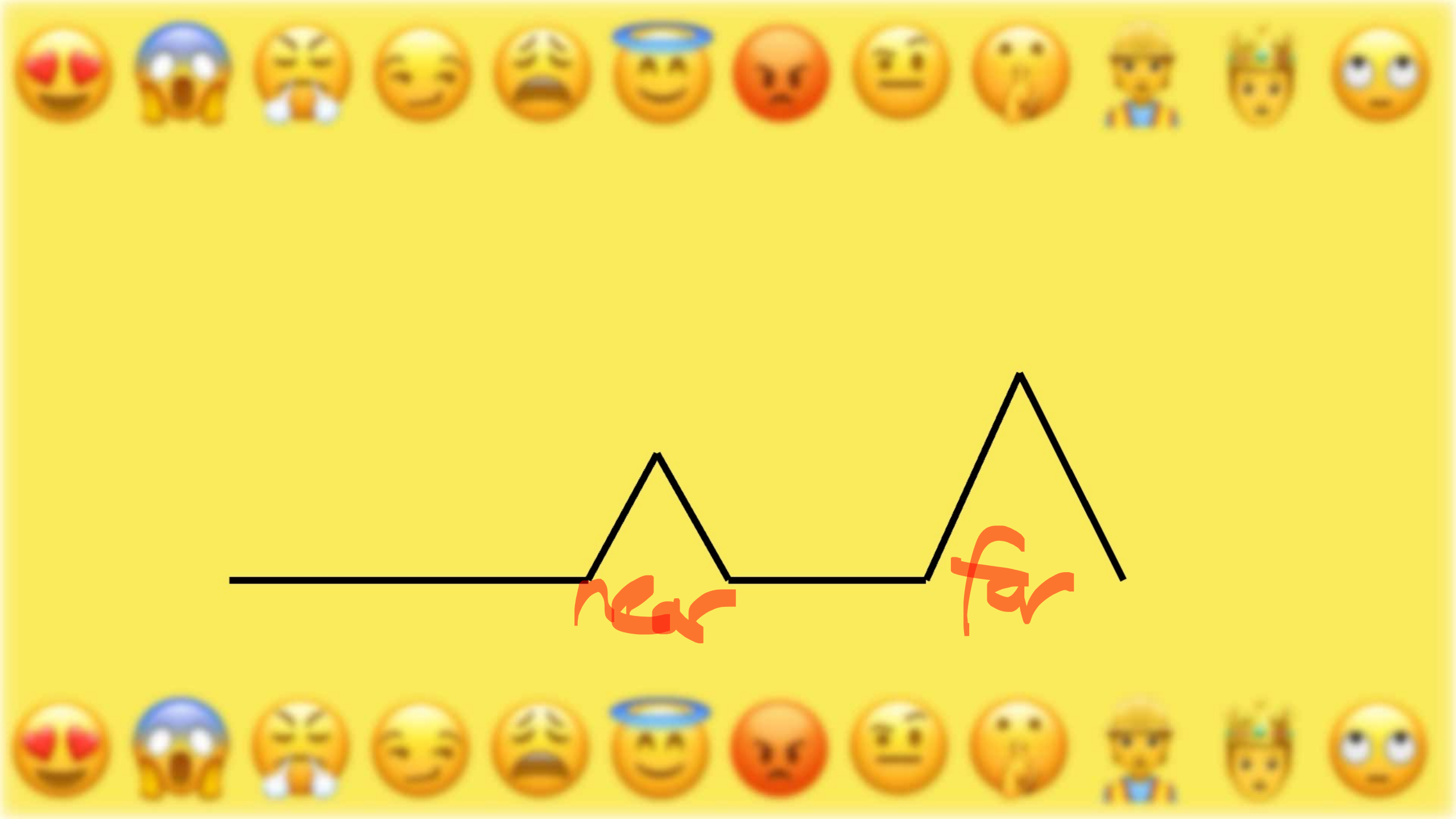

The word of the Lord that came to Hosea son of Beeri during the reigns of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah, and of Jeroboam son of Jehoash, king of Israel.

Hosea 1:1



When the Lord first spoke to Hosea, he said this to him:

**Go and marry a woman of promiscuity,
and have children of promiscuity,
for the land is committing blatant acts of
promiscuity
by abandoning the Lord.**

Hosea 1:2



So he went and married Gomer daughter of Diblaim,
and she conceived and bore him a son. Then the Lord
said to him:

Name him Jezreel, for in a little while
I will bring the bloodshed of Jezreel
on the house of Jehu
and put an end to the kingdom of the house of
Israel.

On that day I will break the bow of Israel
in Jezreel Valley.

Hosea 1:3-5



She conceived again and gave birth to a daughter, and the Lord said to him:

**Name her Lo-ruhamah,
for I will no longer have compassion
on the house of Israel.**

I will certainly take them away.

**But I will have compassion on the house of Judah,
and I will deliver them by the Lord their God.**

**I will not deliver them by bow, sword, or war,
or by horses and cavalry.**

Sign-Act	Gomer and Israel as unfaithful wives (1:2-2:1)		
Accusation	Goes to adulterous lovers for gifts (2:2-8)	Idols, political schemes, and manipulative worship (4:1-8:14)	Israel is not like their father Jacob (11:12-12:14)
Temporary judgment	God will take away her gifts and leave her desolate (2:9-13)	God will destroy Israel's food, children, cult sites, and the nation (9:1-10:15)	God has become Israel's enemy (13:1-16)
Ultimate restoration	God will put away her lovers and establish a new relationship (2:14-23)	God's resolve and Israel's repentance will lead to relationship (11:1-11)	Relationship will be restored through repentance (14:1-8)
Sign-Act	Gomer and Israel are 2 wives awaiting full reconciliation (3:1-5)
