BOTTOM LINE: God uses trials in our lives to grow our faith.

Vs. 1

James a bondservant - James was known as a very direct, straightforward man. Here we see how humble he was.

Bondservant - One who is in a permanent relation of servitude to another.

James did not pull rank, he didn't drop a name; he simply considered himself a servant. - Courson

To the twelve tribes - This is a reference to the dispersion; the Jewish people (who had come to know Jesus as the true Messiah) scattered throughout the world.

Vs. 2

Count it all joy when - James says WHEN (not if) we fall into trials, we are to count it all joy.

James regarded trials as inevitable.- Guzik

Trials are occasions for joy, not discouragement.

Trials can bring us to the end of what is humanly possible and to the beginning of what is only possible by God.

Do not sorrow over your trials, do not look upon them as misfortunes and calamities, they are black vessels, but they are loaded with gold. -Spurgeon

trials - The word trial means both trial and temptation in the original Greek. Peirasmos (Pie-raz-mas)

One of the best tests of Christian maturity is tribulation. When God's people go through personal trials, they discover what kind of faith they really possess. Trials not only reveal our faith; they also develop our faith and Christian character. - Wiersbe

What God sends or allow as a trial, Satan will use as a temptation.

Trials build us up. Temptations tear us down.

Vs. 3

The testing of your faith produces patience - Maturity comes through the testing of our faith.

Faith is tested through trials, not produced in trials. Trials reveal what faith we do have.- Guzik

Faith is as vital to salvation as the heart is vital to the body; hence the javelins of the enemy are mainly aimed at this essential grace. - Spurgeon

God uses trials in our lives to produce patience through our faith.

Vs. 4

Patience - Many of us think of patience as a passive waiting. James describes it as an active exercise. We are to be moving.

Patience brings forth completion.

Perfect and complete - Trials make us complete.

Endure everything; suffer everything that God sends you. - Spurgeon

Counting it all joy is faith's response to a time of trial.- Guzik

Vs. 5

If any of you lacks wisdom - Everyone of us lacks wisdom in some area.

Let him ask of God - Notice that James says to ask of God. Not of your best friend. Not of your co-worker. If you lack wisdom we can ask God.

God is the only teacher of wisdom.- Clarke

The best wisdom is not that which we acquire by study, but that which is the distinct gift of God in answer to prayer. - Spurgeon

Who gives to all liberally and without reproach- God gives us what we need, when we need it. He doesn't hold back. Everything the father does is intentional.

Vs. 6

But let him ask in faith- James says we can ask for wisdom in faith.

Because of Christ, we can come to the Father. Because of Christ, we can ask for wisdom in faith.

For he who doubts is like a wave- James says that when we can't ask in faith, we are like a wave. We are tossed around. We get agitated.

Asking in faith means we acknowledge the sufficiency of God.

Vs. 7-8

Double-minded man- James says that when we are doubled minded, we will live our lives with half of our minds on the world and the other on heaven.

A man of this character is continually distracted; he will neither let earth nor heaven go, and yet he can have but one. - Clarke

Till you get a single heart, till your whole soul is bound up in confidence in God, you cannot expect to be stable in your ways. - Spurgeon
