

Title: Jesus The Servant: It Is Finished Part 1 Scripture: John 19:25-30 Date: 03112018 Bible Version: NKJV

BOTTOM LINE: The work of Christ is perfect, and it fulfills all prophecies.

#### Vs. 25

**Stood by the cross-** Mary saw her Son crucified. She saw Him in pain. She saw how He was humiliated. She was watching her Son die.

*Of all those who looked upon Jesus at the cross, none suffered as Mary did.- Guzik* 

#### Vs. 26

When Jesus therefore saw His mother- Jesus was in the process of dying. He looked down and saw His mother standing there.

It is interesting that Mary the mother of Jesus is not mentioned in either of the synoptic accounts of this scene.-Mounce

**And the disciple whom He loved-** In addition to His mother, He also saw the disciple whom He loved. The disciple is none other than John. He uses this phrasing four times in the gospel of John.

**Woman, behold your son!-** Jesus shows us that even up until the end He showed care towards others.

#### Vs. 27

**Behold your mother-** The word that Jesus did not use when speaking to His mother is the word that He uses to give John a charge.

The word mother would describe a deep and caring relationship.

There was no specific direction given to John to entertain Mary. It was quite enough for the Lord to call his attention to her by saying 'Behold thy mother.' How I wish we were always in such a state of heart that we did not need specific precepts, a hint would suffice.-Spurgeon

# Jesus, knowing that He would soon depart formed this new family.

A family is formed at the Cross because that's where true families are forged and held together.-Courson

That disciple took her to his own home- John and Mary obeyed this command from the cross. Jesus left the care of His mother to John the disciple and apostle

# Vs. 28

I thirst- There is great suffering in not being able to quench your thirst. Of all the things that were done to Jesus to cause pain, this is the one He spoke up about. It reminds us that although Jesus is 100% God, he endured personal agony through it all.

Out of all the pains that He endured upon the cross, and they were many and very sharp, He never mentions one except thirst. - Spurgeon

# Everything relative to the Messiah has been completely fulfilled in Jesus.

## Vs. 29

#### Vessel full of sour wine-

This is not to be confused with pain numbing mixture of wine and myrrh. This was the diluted wine taken to the cross by the soldiers for their own refreshment -Tasker.

## Hyssop-

The very mention of hyssop would take the thoughts of the any Jew back to the saving blood of the Passover lamb. -Barclay (via Guzik)

Vs. 30

It is finished- Having completing His earthly ministry, Jesus was now finished.


#### Two things to note about this statement:

- 1. Jesus has now satisfied the demands of the Fathers justice.
- 2. Jesus has now accomplished all that was written.

This Greek phrase denotes such power that if Jesus' hands hadn't been nailed down, it would have been uttered with a clenched first raised in the air.-Courson

Every other religion and cult bases its teaching on what one must do. Christianity bases its teaching on what has already been done.

When a sinner thirsts, all they have to do is to bring their thirsty soul to Jesus. He satisfies.

Scripture: John 3:16
