

Title: Simply Jesus:Rejected. John 15:18-27

Date: 10/01/2017 **Bible Version:** NKJV

BOTTOM LINE: Even though Christ has been rejected by the world, He is the only hope for the world.

Vs. 18

If the world hates you- Jesus informed the disciples that the world would hate them. Because Jesus was going to be rejected, they too would also be rejected.

As good as Jesus was and even in light of the miracles He did, the world still hated Him.

You know that it hated Me before it hated you- Even though the disciples would be hated by the world, they would be in good company (with Christ). John communicated that the disciples would know this.

Christians will see plenty of hatred from the world, that's why we need to <u>love</u> and <u>support</u> one another.

Vs. 19

The world would love its own-The world will not champion Christian values or Christ. The world will always champion a movie target of values.

But I chose you- Jesus reassures the disciples that they were chosen. There was nothing in them that merited the favor of God. Likewise, those of us in Christ Jesus have been chosen as well.

If you are living a Godly <u>lifestyle</u>, know that the world will come against you. Also know that this reminds us of our <u>position</u> in Christ.

We have hope in Christ Jesus.

- 1. A hope that heals the most broken of hearts.
- 2. A hope that comforts in the most hopeless of situations.

3. A hope that exists for every person.

Vs. 20

If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you- Jesus was primarily persecuted by the religious establishment.

One may be religious and very much be part of the world.- Guzik

Vs. 21

Because they do not know Him who sent me- When people don't know God they often attack those who do know Him.

Vs. 22

They have no excuse for their sin- If Jesus did not come, mankind could just carry on indulging in sin and no one would feel uncomfortable.

Vs. 23

also- Jesus makes a powerful proclamation. If you hate Him, then you also hate the Father.

You can't love the Father without loving the Son.

Vs. 24

If I had not done among them the works- Jesus refers back to the miracles He did before them and all mankind.

Now they have seen and also hated- Even with the miracles and signs there were those who still opposed and hated Jesus.

Signs and miracles won't change people. Only the Holy Spirit can change people.

Vs. 25

That the word might be fulfilled- Jesus testifies of Himself. He came to fulfill the word.

They hated Jesus because:

- 1. He was not bringing Israel back to her glory.
- 2. He was uneducated yet was wise beyond His years.

3. He opposed what they turned religion into.

Vs. 26

But when the Helper comes- Jesus reminds the disciples of the promise of the Holy Spirit.

This is an encouragement to those of us going through difficult times. The Holy Spirit is present. He is with you.

Vs. 27

And you also- Notice that opportunity to bear witness was also given to the disciples, and to us.

We were not born into this world to have an encounter with Jesus, learn about Him and simply endure the world's hatred. We have a helper that will assist us as we live our lives as witnesses for Jesus Christ.
