



Sermon Guide: Walk in Christ Alone - 03/22/26

Text(s): Colossians 2:6-15

Big Idea: Since we have received Christ as our supreme, sovereign, and sufficient Savior and Lord, we must walk in Him alone.

Summary of the Sermon - In Colossians 2:6–15, Paul urges believers to continue living in the same way they first received Christ—by grace through faith—because Jesus alone is fully sufficient for salvation and spiritual life. The Colossians were being tempted by false teachings that suggested Christ was not enough, but Paul reminds them that Christ is fully God, and in Him believers are completely filled, forgiven, and made alive. Through His death and resurrection, Jesus defeated sin, canceled our debt, and triumphed over spiritual powers. Therefore, Christians are called to remain rooted, built up, and grounded in Christ alone, rejecting anything that competes with Him and living with gratitude, confidence, and obedience.

Discussion Questions

1. When you hear the phrase “Christ is enough,” what does that mean to you personally right now?
2. Paul says we should “walk in Him” the same way we received Him. What does that look like practically in everyday life?
3. Which image stands out more to you—being “rooted,” “built up,” or “established”? Why?
4. What are some signs that someone is drifting from being rooted in Christ to relying on themselves?
5. Paul connects spiritual maturity with “abounding in thanksgiving.” Why do you think gratitude is such an important marker of faith?
6. What are some modern-day “philosophies” or beliefs that can subtly pull us away from trusting in Christ alone?
7. How can you practically evaluate whether something is “according to Christ” or not?
8. Paul says we are already “filled in Him.” Where do you personally feel tempted to look for “something more” beyond Christ?
9. Which truth about your identity in Christ (forgiven, alive, free, victorious, etc.) do you most need to believe right now—and why?
10. How does knowing that Jesus has already defeated sin, death, and spiritual powers change the way you face struggles or temptation this week?
11. What is one area of your life where you need to more fully “walk in Christ alone” this week?
