



Sermon Guide: Christ Has Done it All - 02/22/26

Text(s): Colossians 1:15-20

Big Idea: *Christ is supreme over all, therefore He is sufficient for all.*

Summary of the Sermon - In Colossians 1:15–20, Paul declares the absolute supremacy of Jesus Christ: He is the visible image of the invisible God, the Creator and Sustainer of all things, and the Head of the Church. Because all things were created through Him and for Him, our identity and purpose are found not in ourselves but in His glory. Through the blood of His cross, Christ reconciles sinners and will ultimately make all things new—He has done it all because He is over all.

Discussion Questions

1. Who is Jesus to you personally? In what ways might you be holding a “less than” view of Christ without realizing it?
2. Paul emphasizes that Christ is the *image of the invisible God*. Why does it matter that Jesus is fully God and not merely a teacher, prophet, or moral example?
3. The text says all things were created *through Him and for Him*. What does it practically look like to live “for Him” in ordinary routines like work, parenting, or friendships?
4. Where are you tempted to find your identity—success, appearance, politics, relationships, achievements? How does Christ’s supremacy challenge those foundations?
6. The sermon argues that false views of Christ lead to false worship. What subtle “functional saviors” compete for your worship today?
7. How does understanding that sin alienates us from God help explain what is broken in the world—and in your own heart?
8. How does believing that Christ created and sustains all things (including you) change the way you think about your daily life?
9. What does it mean to you that reconciliation and peace come “by the blood of His cross,” not by your effort or moral performance?
