TODAY'S SUMMARY: AT THE REQUEST OF THE JEWISH LEADERSHIP, PILATE GRANTS A GUARD AND SETS A SEAL ON THE TOMB OF JESUS

THE BURIAL OF JESUS' BODY

As evening approached, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who had himself become a disciple of Jesus. Going to Pilate, he asked for Jesus' body, and Pilate ordered that it be given to him. Joseph took the body, wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, and placed it in his own new tomb that he had cut out of the rock. He rolled a big stone in front of the entrance to the tomb and went away. Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were sitting there opposite the tomb.

The next day, (Saturday), the one after Preparation Day, the chief priests and the Pharisees went to Pilate. "Sir," they said, "we remember that while he was still alive that deceiver said, 'After three days I will rise again.' So give the order for the tomb to be made secure until the third day. Otherwise, his disciples may come and steal the body and tell the people that he has been raised from the dead. This last deception will be worse than the first." "Take a guard," Pilate answered. "Go, make the tomb as secure as you know how." So they went and made the tomb secure by putting a seal on the stone and posting the guard.

3. THE GUARD

WHERE DID JESUS GO WHEN HE GAVE UP HIS SPIRIT?

For Christ also <u>suffered</u> once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. <u>He was put to death</u> in the body but <u>made alive in the Spirit</u>. <u>After</u> being made alive, <u>he went</u> and made proclamation <u>to the imprisoned spirits</u>—to those who were disobedient long ago when God waited patiently in the days of Noah while the ark was being built. In it only a few people, eight in all, were saved through water, and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at God's right hand—with angels, authorities and powers in submission to him.

THE RICH MAN AND LAZARUS

There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and lived in luxury every day. Luke 16:19
