## ECCLESIOLOGY EPISODE 12 OF 12

And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way.

## 1. THEOLOGY PROPER AND ECCLESIOLOGY

Understanding theology proper helps the Church grasp God's character, shaping its worship and mission.

Don't you know that you yourselves are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in your midst? 1 Corinthians 3:16

#### 2. BIBLIOLOGY AND ECCLESIOLOGY

The Church relies on biblical authority to define its doctrine, structure, and mission.

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16-17

#### 3. CHRISTOLOGY AND ECCLESIOLOGY

The Church's identity and purpose stem from its connection with Christ, its head.

And he is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything he might have the supremacy. Colossians 1:18

# 4. PNEUMATOLOGY AND ECCLESIOLOGY

The Holy Spirit empowers the Church for worship, service, and spiritual growth.

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. Acts 1:8

#### 5. ANGELOLOGY AND DEMONOLOGY IN ECCLESIOLOGY

Ecclesiology acknowledges spiritual warfare, seeking divine protection and discernment.

For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Ephesians 6:12

#### 6. ESCHATOLOGY AND ECCLESIOLOGY

Understanding eschatology informs the Church's mission urgency and eternal perspective.

He who testifies to these things says, 'Yes, I am coming soon.'

Amen. Come, Lord Jesus. Revelation 22:20

#### 7. ANTHROPOLOGY AND ECCLESIOLOGY

**Ecclesiology** embraces human diversity, unity, and purpose within the Church community.

Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many. 1 Corinthians 12:12-14

#### 8. HARMATOLOGY AND ECCLESIOLOGY

Addressing sin's impact, the Church seeks redemption and restoration, fostering a culture of repentance.

Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. James 5:16



#### 9. MISSIOLOGY AND ECCLESIOLOGY

Ecclesiology shapes missional strategies, emphasizing the Church's role in global evangelism and discipleship.

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age. Matthew 28:19-20

#### 10. SOTERIOLOGY AND ECCLESIOLOGY

Understanding salvation influences the Church's mission and ministry, leading to a transformed life.

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. Ephesians 2:8-10
