

Bible study for the week starting June 2, 2024

SHARE

Jesus calls you to be willing to die for a Savior you've never seen. First of all, would you? Second of all, WHY?!

READ/STUDY/DISCUSS

- 1. Read **1 Peter 1:1-12**. What do you know about Peter, based on his life as a disciple in the Gospels and then as an apostle in the book of Acts?
- 2. Peter is writing to Christians who are scattered and persecuted to affirm their "living hope." What in this passage resonates with you in our surroundings today, and what is different?
- Read Isaiah 40:28-31. This is a classic and well-known on those who "wait" and "hope" in the Lord.
 What benefits does this hope bring? How does that apply to your life?
- 4. Read John 16:25-33. The certainty of tribulation came up in an "end times" sermon a couple weeks ago, and surfaces in 1 Peter 1. Does suffering scare you? Why or why not? Think of some of the things Jesus spoke in red letters outside of the Gospels (Hebrews 13:5, 2 Corinthians 12:9, not to mention Revelation). What comfort does Jesus offer?

PRAY

Pray for the Holy Spirit's strength to withstand suffering and remain faithful unto death.



HOPE IN HARD TIMES

1 Peter 1:1-12 (Isaiah 40:28-31; John 16:25-33) June 2, 2024 – Pastor Eric Van Scharrel

You do not seek the fight; the fight finds you. Meanwhile, you have <u>COMPASSION</u> on your <u>ENEMIES</u> and <u>PRAY</u> for your <u>PERSECUTORS</u>.

You <u>NEED</u> hope, and the Triune God <u>OFFERS</u> that hope.

'According to His great mercy, He has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead...' -1 Peter 1:3

IMPERISHABLE, **UNDEFILED**, and **UNFADING**.

Real people, likely people they <u>KNEW</u>, were being <u>PERSECUTED</u> and even <u>MARTYRED</u> for their faith.

Peter gives them encouragement to <u>DIE</u> for a Savior most of them have never <u>SEEN</u>.

You are given hope that leads to an inexpressible <u>JOY</u> that can't be taken from you no matter what <u>CRUCIBLE</u> you face.
