

# Bible study for the week starting February 5, 2023

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
The Portals of Prayer devotion for January 31 says: "Everyone has a religion. If you find meaning in life from nature of Buddhism or the Bible or academics or whatever, then that's your religion. That's your god." What can you learn about someone's god from how they spend their time? How they spend their money? Where they find their meaning?

## **READ/STUDY/DISCUSS**

- 1. The "material principal" of our denomination is that "the Bible is the only source and norm of what we believe and how we pattern our life, and the "formal principal" is that we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus. These vary across denominations (or non-denominations) and world religions. Why does it matter what your source material is, and what your central teaching is? (see also 2 Tim. 3:15 and Acts 15:11) (see <a href="tinyurl.com/4fcrvw7k">tinyurl.com/4fcrvw7k</a> for examples)
- 2. Read **Acts 17:16-34**. The Athenians might be closer to our culture than the Bereans at the end of Acts 16. How do you see Paul engaging their culture in a way that makes sense? How would you have done it?
- 3. Paul doesn't spend his time disassembling the idolatry and false philosophies; he points to Jesus as the fulfillment of these truths they're seeking. How can engage our culture like that; what might that look like?
- 4. Read **Romans 1:16-32**. Paul builds a case (witness) not based on their trust in Scripture, but rather their knowledge of God as revealed in creation (natural knowledge). What resonates with you in this?
- 5. Read **Matthew 4:12-17**. As Jesus began His ministry, He preached repentance and the imminence of the kingdom of God, but also to not just the Jews but the Gentiles. In other words, Paul didn't invent being "all things to all people;" it might have started with Jesus.

### **PRAY**

6. Pray that God would give you the eyes of Jesus and the perception of Jesus to engage our community with the Gospel.



# Zoom In; Zoom Out Acts 17:16-34 February 5, 2023 – Pastor Eric Van Scharrel

The Bible is the **ONLY** source and norm of what we believe and how we are to pattern our life. (see 2 Tim. 3:15, Acts 15:11)

Your approach in preaching the Gospel will <u>VARY</u> from one person to the next. Evangelism isn't a <u>FORMULA</u>.

"His spirit was <u>PROVOKED</u> within him as he saw that the city was full of idols." -Acts 17:16

"...What therefore you worship as <u>UNKNOWN</u>, this I proclaim to you." -Acts 17:22-23

When Paul is talking to people who respect the Bible as the Word of God, he builds a case on <u>SCRIPTURE</u>. When he is talking to everyone else, he builds a case starting with <u>CREATION</u>. (Acts 17:24-28, Romans 1:16-32).

Paul zoomed out to show that Jesus is the **EMBODIMENT** of every truth you have been trying to gather.

Jesus becomes not the <u>ENEMY</u> of these partial, zoomed-in truths; He becomes the <u>FULFILLMENT</u>.

What if we pay attentiont to the <u>CULTURE</u> and <u>CONVERSATIONS</u> around us, so we can meet others on <u>COMMON</u> ground and work from there?
