
Does death scare you? Does it excite you? Somewhere in between? What questions do you have about death and eternity?

READ/STUDY/DISCUSS

- 1. Read **Ezekiel 37:1-14**. This is a vision we can read in context to give hope to people in a hopless situation, but it also gives us a compelling visual of the power of the "Word of the Lord" to resurrect and resuscitate. How does this help (or not) you envision how God can resurrect ashes and dust?
- 2. Read 1 Corinthians 15:17-26. Why is it not sufficient to just believe in a spiritual eternity? What extra (and specific) hope are we given through the promise of the resurrection of Jesus...and ours?
- 3. This chapter 1 Corinthians 15 starts by establishing the certainty of the resurrection and ends by establishing how it matters for both your eternity and your present life. Take a few minutes to look at the beginning and end of this chapter.
- 4. Read Luke 24:36-49. Jesus clearly works to establish His physical resurrection how? How does this affirm His specifics regarding what He came to do? And what transformation comes in the lives of those who hear through this message and promise?

Pray to Jesus – the Resurrection and the Life – that our certain hope of eternity positively affects our present life.

DYING is not just a physical but a spiritual process.


Jesus did not **CHANGE** belief about the resurrection; He **ENHANCED** it.
