READ/STUDY/DISCUSS

1. Read **Psalm 90:12-17**

- a. Advent reminds us on the tension between numbering our days and asking for the Lord's return.
- b. How ready are you for the Lord's second coming?

2. Read Matt 18:1-6

- a. Do you ever have the desire to be the greatest? Feel the need to be the best?
- b. How does Jesus measure greatness in a way that is maybe different than we do?

3. Read Matt 18:10-14

a. God seeks the lost, the lowly, and ordinary. (Where do we see this in the Christmas story?) How is this a comfort? How does this challenge you?

4. Read 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

- a. Clay jars were disposable. Do you ever feel disposable? Like you are not worth enough?
- b. "The gospel is this: We are more sinful and flawed in ourselves than we ever dared believe, yet
 at the very same time we are more loved and accepted in Jesus Christ than we ever dared hope."

5. Read 2 Corinthians 4:16

a. How can our inner self be renewed when we our outer self is being drained?
