READ/STUDY/DISCUSS

- 1. Read John 8:56-59. Why did Jesus' answer/claim so enrage the people?
- 2. Read also John 9:1-41. Jesus goes on from being almost stoned by the people to healing the man born blind. Take a look at the antagonistic back-and-forth between the blind man and the Jews. How would you summarize the difference between sight and blindness when it comes to faith?
- 3. Read Isaiah 6:8-10. Throughout Scripture, faith is referenced as sight and unbelief as blindness. Why do you think some people are so resistant to faith/sight?
- 4. Read 1 Corinthians 1:18-31. Paul describes the message of the cross as "folly to those who are perishing" and "the power of God to us who are being saved." How does this discussion of wisdom/folly relate to the discussion of sight/blindness?

Pray for a receptive heart, soul and mind to the powerful Gospel of Jesus Christ, and eyes of faith through which we can see the world.
