## **READ/STUDY/DISCUSS**

- 2. Read Genesis 8:11-17. Noah's ark and all the animals get used to decorate children's nurseries all the time, but the Flood was an incredibly dark time in world history. Think about how long of a warning the people were given, and how none of them heeded it. What lessons can we learn for today?
- 3. Read 1 Timothy 2:1-6. There is a beautiful verse in this passage that illustrates God's desire for all to be saved and come to a knowledge of the truth. How do you reconcile this desire with the fact that *most* are not?
- 4. Read Luke 13:22-35. Jesus talks about the narrow door as an answer to a question about how many will be saved. What insight does Jesus' answer give? What lessons can you take from it.
- 5. A main them of Sunday's message was about intentionality and urgency. As tragedy hit our congregation last weekend, our total attendance numbers (online plus in-person) bumped up about 300 from the week before. At the start of Covid, numbers spiked. The same for 9/11. What might this tell us about the spiritual condition of our people, both good and bad? Think again about those topics of intentionality and urgency.
