What's your favorite or most memorable Easter moment from your childhood?

READ/STUDY/DISCUSS

- 1. Read Matthew 28:1-10. If you take away 5 of the 89 chapters of the Gospels, you lose the resurrection and Jesus stays in the tomb. What's the emotional tone of these verses as Matthew records the story?
- 2. Read Jeremiah 31:1-6. God promises He has loved us with an everlasting love. What are the promises you hear in these verses?
- 3. Read Colossians 3:1-4. What does it mean for your life that you have been "raised with Christ?" The verse literally means "co-resurrected;" how are we living in this reality even now?
- 4. Read **Exodus 14:10-15:1.** This is an assigned reading for Easter sunrise service. This was the great salvation event of the Old Testament, and it ended in a song of praise. What are the parallels you see between this and Easter?
- 5. Read 1 Corinthians 15:1-11. This whole chapter is worth a read. What are the facts, and what are the implications for our lives based on these verses?
- 6. Read **John 20:1-18**. John gives his account of the resurrection story, and he personalizes it for one believer: Mary Magdalene. How does her experience become *our* experience?
