

Bible study for the week starting June 16, 2024

SHARE

We have a loving but strict Father in God. Were your parents strict or permissive when you grew up?

READ/STUDY/DISCUSS

- 1. Read 1 Peter 2:1-12. Peter uses the metaphor of stones in different ways. Explore the point he's making, and what His purpose is in us living this way.
- 2. Read 1 Peter 2:13-25. Peter gives a tough assignment for people living under an evil empire. How do you apply these exhortations to our world today?
- 3. Read **Psalm 103.** This Psalm captures God's character so well, including His love as Father toward us, His children. How does this give perspective to the challenges of living as fallen people in a fallen world?
- 4. Read **John 10:22-30.** This is a reminder of the love of the Father for you: that you are in His hands, and no one can snatch you out. What kind of confidence does this give you as you navigate a world that in many ways stands in opposition to Him?

PRAY

Pray for your vocations as citizens and within family relationships as you seek to be living stones that glorify God.



LIVING STONES & STUBBED TOES

1 Peter 2 (Psalm 103:8-13; John 10:22-30) June 16, 2024 – Pastor Eric Van Scharrel

Sanctification is a process that has stops, starts and <u>SETBACKS</u>, but the most powerful tool you have at your disposal is the <u>WORD</u> of God.

The metaphor: "...like LIVING STONES..."

The paradox: The same stone that is the <u>CORNERSTONE</u> of our faith is a <u>STUMBLING</u> <u>STONE</u> for those who reject the Gospel.

"Chapter 1 doesn't sound that much like PETER."

The root cause of <u>DISOBEDIENCE</u> is the <u>REJECTION</u> of the Word of God, in all its truth and grace.

3 of these things is just like the other; 1 of these things is not the same: "Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. HONOR the EMPEROR" (1 Peter 2:17).

Yes, this from Peter, who once cut off a soldier's EAR.

What does it look like to exhibit an <u>ALL-WEATHER</u> faithfulness in a <u>FAIR-WEATHER</u> world?

Jesus is our <u>STANDARD</u> – our <u>SUBSTITUTE</u> – our <u>SHEPHERD</u>.
