What are you "fixin" to do currently? If someone had a 360 look at your life and concluded, "They must be preparing for something." What do you think that person would say?

READ/STUDY/DISCUSS

Read Revelation 16:1-7?

- a. How do you approach the wrath of God? Do you feel like you have to stand in defense of God? Or not?
- b. How does this look like the plagues in Egypt? What was the purpose of those?

Read Revelation 16:8-11

a. The response to both of these bowls was a lack of repentance. When has God's wrath lead you to repentance? Or does God's wrath lead to blame? How?

Read Revelation 16:12-14

a. In the midst of wrath...deceiving spirits are let loose. It takes wisdom to discern truth. How do you discern the law and the gospel in your own life?

Read Revelation 16:15

a. Be awake... and stay clothed. Read Matthew 22:1-14. What are the clothes needed? How are you to BE READY?

Read Revelation 16:16

a. What do you think of when you hear Armageddon? What if you knew this was a reference to a real place? Mt. Megiddo. A bunch of battles fought here.

Read Hebrews 12:1-2

What are we called to fix our focus on in any and every circumstance? How do you do this personally? How can you grow in this discipline?

Pray for whatever wrath is unleashed on the world to lead us to the Lord...For wisdom and discernment, and repentance. Pray that we don't procrastinate our faith.,
