READ/STUDY/DISCUSS

- 1. What is a creed, based on what you heard in Sunday's sermon? Do you agree that "everyone has a creed" they hold central and by which they live? What good is a creed?
- 2. Read Acts 25:1-12. Paul knew he would have to testorify about the facts of the Gospel in Rome someday. Why wasn't he afraid?
- 3. Read **Romans 8:18-28**. What are the promises of God, *just* in these verses? What does this add to our faith?
- 4. Read **John 21:1-14**. Jesus appeared to the disciples again by the Sea of Galilee, and then for good measure, gave them a miraculous catch of fish. This kind of brings the disciples' relationship with Jesus full-circle; how? What was the point of Him showing up here?
- 5. Jesus doesn't just teach us how to live; He teaches us how to die. What does this mean???
