



Bible study for the week starting June 5, 2022

SHARE

1. Think back to your childhood. What's the thing you got to help do that made you feel the most useful to your mother or father? (I'll start: mowing/raking hay and moving bales, helping with harvest, etc.) What's the most useful way God has used you to help Him?

READ/STUDY/DISCUSS

2. Read Acts 1:1-11. We are kicking off a year in the book of Acts this year. Based on how Luke begins (and how he ended Luke), what can we anticipate hearing and seeing?
3. Read Genesis 11:1-9. This is a regularly assigned Old Testament reading for Pentecost; what does it have to do with Pentecost? Why did God confuse their language, and what was the miracle of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (see Acts 2)?
4. Read John 14:23-31. Jesus promised the Holy Spirit; what were the gifts Jesus promised?
5. Read Acts 2:1-21. This is the account of Pentecost. What was the effect of Peter's proclamation of the Law and Gospel? How does this continue to happen today?

PRAY

6. Pray for the Holy Spirit to continue this work that started on Pentecost, and pray specifically for those people in your life that need to hear the reason for the hope you have in Christ.
