Biography of Pastor Jimmy Davis Hubbard Jr.

Rev. Jimmy D. Hubbard was born in Meridian, Mississippi. He spent his boyhood years in New Orleans, LA and at the age of 15 Rev. Hubbard moved back to his birthplace (Meridian, MS) where he attended Northwest Jr. High and from there he went on to attain his High School Diploma from Meridian High School. While serving as a police cadet with the Meridian Police Department, Rev. Hubbard accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. He has a daughter Japinica Hubbard and two biological grand children Jamir


and Jelani as well as several surrogate grand children whom he spends a lot of time with during his down time.

In the beginning of 1992 he entered the military under the delayed entry program and on May 27 he left for basic training. While serving his country Rev. Hubbard was called into the Gospel ministry in 1996 under Pastor R. Williams at Camp Walker Chapel in Taegu, Korea. He was licensed into the Gospel ministry under the leadership of Pastor Obadiah Clemmons, Mt. Olive Missionary Baptist Church, of Meridian, MS. He was ordained under the leadership of Pastor Willie J. Freeman, Greater Missionary Baptist Church, of Clarksville, TN.

He is the newly elected Pastor of Greater Missionary Baptist Church in Clarksville, TN. Additionally, in the past 25 years Rev, Hubbard has served in the capacity of youth pastor, singles director, adult teacher for Sunday School, Bible study, and VBS as well as one of the Chief Care Ministers of Greater Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Willie J. Freeman.

After 7 years of honorable service he left the military and matriculated through the halls of academia attaining his credentials in Automotive Technology (Tennessee Technology Center); Forensic Science (School of Criminal Justice); Bachelors in Business Administration (Austin Peay State University); Master's of Science Degree (Capella University); and numerous semester hours towards his Masters of Divinity (Southern Baptist Theological Seminary).

Rev. Hubbard has preached at numerous gatherings and in many settings and platforms around the world. He is a student of continuous learning and he is a lifetime advocate for education. He aspires to author books and be a role model to men and young men by mentoring and discipling them in the things of God. Rev. Hubbard believes that Christians should enjoy life to the fullest and his favorite scripture is: Romans 8:28 "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose."



Dr. Rick Stevens Cumberland Baptist Association

Dr. Stevens comes to the Cumberland Baptist Association from the pastorate. He pastored churches in Kentucky, Georgia, Alabama, Ohio, Indiana, and Mississippi. Dr. Stevens earned his MDiv and DMin from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, KY. He has served in various leadership positions both on the state and local level. He is married to his wife, Shirley and has two children Valerie and Sam.

History of Greater Missionary Baptist Church

Pastor Kim Allen and the members of the Little West Fork Baptist Church saw a need to reach people for Christ and a need to reach the African American Community. After much prayer and thoughtful consideration, Little West Fork Baptist Church agreed to use "The Old Church Building" to start a mission. Pastor Kim Allen contacted Brother Willie J. Freeman about working with the Mission. After several meetings and much prayer, Brother Willie J. Freeman, under the direction of the Holy Spirit, agreed to take on the responsibility of giving leadership to the new mission work. On the 10th of May 1993, during the morning worship service at Little West Fork Baptist Church, it was voted and agreed upon to call Brother Willie J. Freeman as Mission Pastor. Pastor Freeman was led by the Holy Spirit to name the Mission "Greater Missionary Baptist Mission". After many weeks and much hard work, the old church building was ready for worship.

On September 5, 1993 at 11:00 am, Greater Missionary Baptist Mission held its first service. There was a grand total of three people present during worship service. The first members to join were Sister Jean Lyle, by Christian Experience; Sis Vanessa Lyle, by Baptism and Sis Annie Bonds by letter. Shortly after the first worship service in September 1993, the old church building was set on fire by an unknown person who was never apprehended and still hasn't been apprehended until this day. The structure damage to the building was very limited due to the quick response of the Clarksville Fire Department and one of our members that lived across the street from the church. The burning of the black churches in America called for a National protest and a national outcry. Later that year Pastor Freeman along with other pastors whose churches had been badly damaged or completely destroyed by arsonist, met with President Bill Clinton and Attorney General Janet Reno at the White House in Washington, DC to voice their complaints and concerns about the burning of the black churches in America. From that historical meeting in 1996, God intervened and the crime for burning or damaging any church or place of worship was changed from a misdemeanor to a federal hate crime.

As the Mission continued to grow, Brother Lewis Dorris agreed to sell approximately four acres of land located on Ringgold Road. With the help of the Tennessee Baptist Convention, the land was purchased. On the 25th of June 1995, with 230 Charter Members Greater Missionary Baptist Mission was constituted as a Baptist Church by Little West Fork Baptist Church. The Ground breaking service was held on the same day at 2 pm and since the constitution of the Church we have moved into our present place of worship and have gained over 4500 new members and Baptized over 1000 people.

On May 11, 1997, the members of Greater Missionary Baptist Church, Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church, Little West Fork Baptist Church, Cumberland Baptist Association, Clarksville Mayor Don Trotter and many other community supporters, marched from the "Old Church Building" to the "New One". The continual growth in numbers and spirituality demonstrates the power of the Holy Spirit in the Church. With over 38 separate ministries, the needs of the Clarksville community and the Church members are being met. To further acknowledge our success, Greater Missionary has received the Baptismal Achievement Record, ranking 14th in the state, along with awards from the Tennessee Baptist Convention and the Evangelism Strategies Team. As of August 2022, 14 Ministers has been ordained, 47 Deacons ordained, 34 Ministers Licensed and 5 mission churches started. In October 2000, Greater Missionary began construction on Phase II of our building program, the Christian Education and Child Development Center at the cost of over \$700,000.00. Phase II consisted of 12 classrooms, 2 toddler and children's rooms, finance room, fellowship hall and kitchen. Broady Construction Company completed the building in July 2001. Phase III, started in February 2009 at a cost of \$2,450,000, it consisted of building a 12,000 sq. ft. Little Visionary Daycare Center and redesigning our parking lot. We moved into our state of the art daycare facility in January 2011. The facility was dedicated on the 4th Sunday, May 22, 2011@ 2:00pm. The daycare facility closed in August 2013. It is now our GMBC Visionary Center. In July 2011 our GMBC Prayer Garden was established as a peaceful place to pray and meditate.

On September 30, 2021, Founding Pastor Willie J. Freeman under the direction of the Holy Spirit announced at the Annual Business Meeting that in lieu of his retirement Chief Care Minister Jimmy D. Hubbard would be appointed as the new Pastor of Greater Missionary Baptist Church. February 6, 2022 would mark the last day of pastoring for Founding Pastor Willie J. Freeman. On February 7, 2022, after many months of prayer and thoughtful consideration, Pastor Elect Jimmy D. Hubbard assumed the responsibility as the Pastor of Greater Missionary Baptist Church. February 10, 2022, during a special call meeting, it was voted and agreed upon to accept the appointment of Rev. Jimmy Hubbard to be the Pastor of Greater Missionary Baptist Church. On April 10, 2022, Greater Missionary Baptist Church held it's Pastoral installation service and Rev. Jimmy D. Hubbard was installed as the New Pastor of Greater Missionary Baptist Church.

During the pandemic, Greater Missionary Baptist Church continued to grow spiritually and numerically as the Hand of God continues to be manifested in this ministry.
