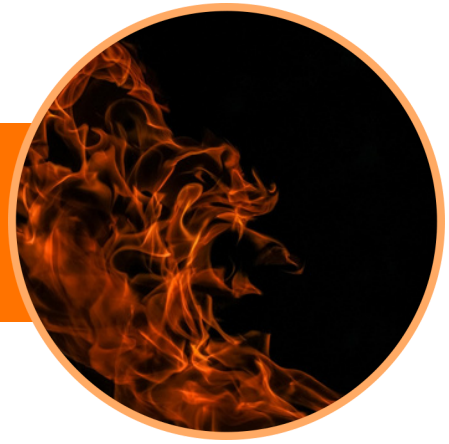
### SUMMARY

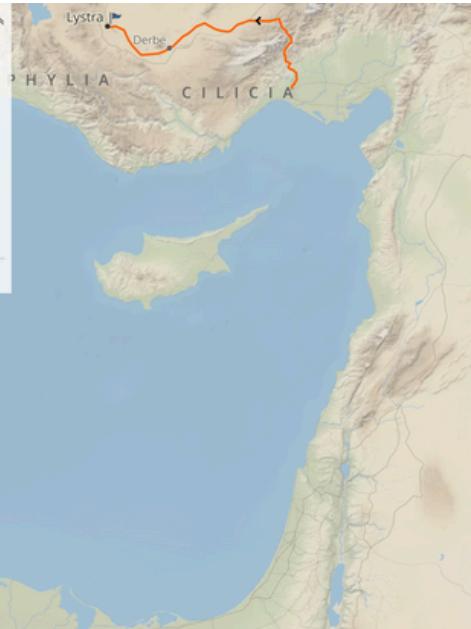

## The Tullianum: A Prison in Rome

The Romans did not consider imprisonment itself a form of punishment—prisons were used to hold those awaiting trial or the death penalty and often served as places of execution. Prisons were filthy and crowded, and prisoners were treated as little better than dead. According to tradition, Peter and Paul were both imprisoned here.

Prisoners were lowered into the prison through a hole in the floor.



CUT-AWAY VIEW

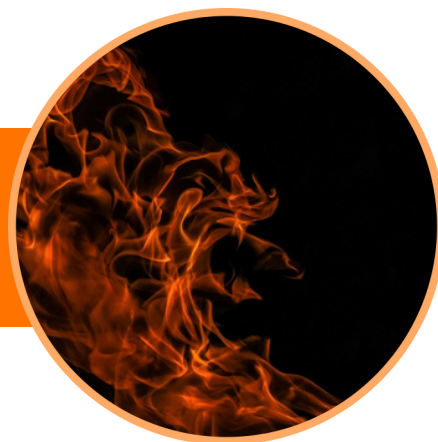
This door led to an underground sewer.

The Tullianum, like many prisons in the ancient world, was dark, damp, and cold. It was built originally as a cistern.

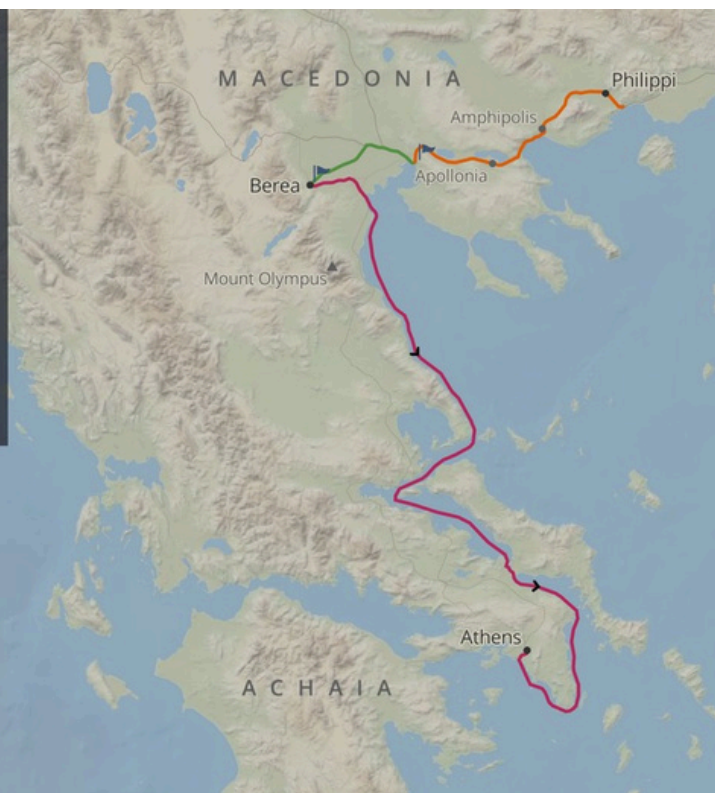

## Mars' Hill in Athens

At Mars' Hill, also known as the Areopagus, Paul used an inscription to an "unknown god" as a starting point for proclaiming the good news of Christ to the Greeks. He confronted widespread idol worship by declaring the true identity of the Creator. Using Greek worship and poetry, Paul articulated God's demand for repentance and His provision of salvation through Jesus: "Then Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said ... 'What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you'" (Acts 17:22, 23).

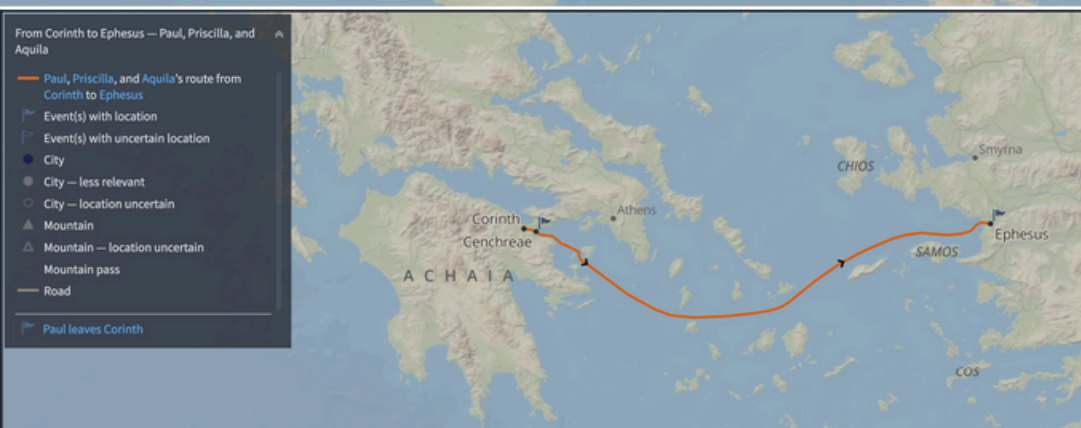
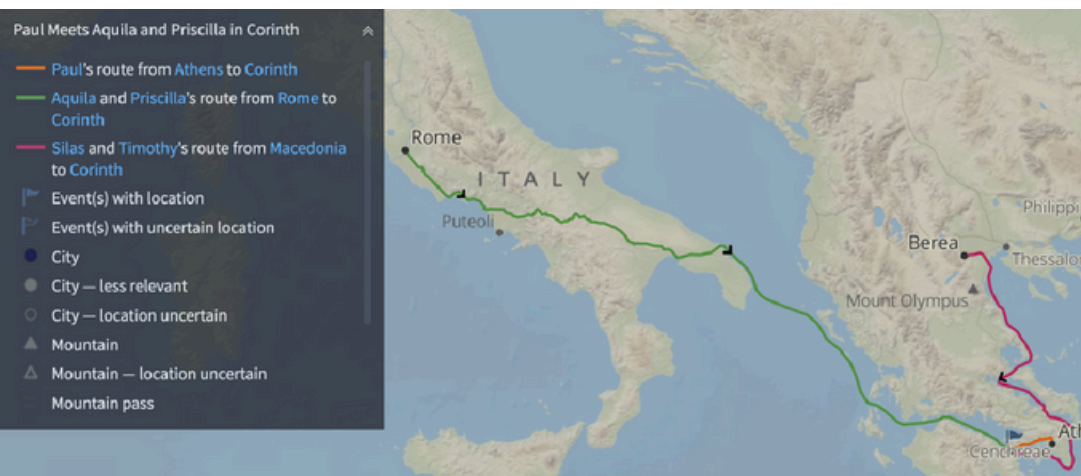
### SUMMARY

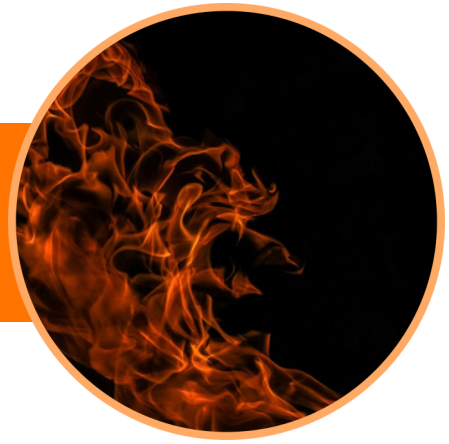

#### The Nazirite Vow

"And the Lord spoke to Moses saying, 'Speak to the people of Israel and say to them, when either a man or a woman makes a special vow, the vow of a Nazirite, to separate themselves to the Lord...' Numbers 6: 1-2

#### TWO PATHS TO SERVICE

God-ordained lifelong calling from conception including Samson, Samuel and John the Baptist

Short-term commitment as a sign of penitence and devotion including the Apostle Paul and many other Israelite men and women

**PROHIBITIONS:**

- No drinking wine, eating grapes or consuming anything produced by the vine
- No cutting hair or shaving head
- No visiting burial sites

**IN THE EVENT OF DEFILEMENT:**

- Shave head
- Two turtle doves and one male lamb as offerings to priest
- Recommit to vow

**OFFERINGS UPON VOW COMPLETION:**

- One-year-old male lamb as a burnt offering
- One-year-old ewe lamb as a sin offering
- Ram as a peace offering
- Shave head, place hair under fire of peace offering

**As well as:**

- Basket of unleavened bread
- Loaves of fine flour mixed with oil
- Unleavened wafers smeared with oil
- Grain offering and Drink offerings

- Gynaikon (room reserved for women only)
- Slave room

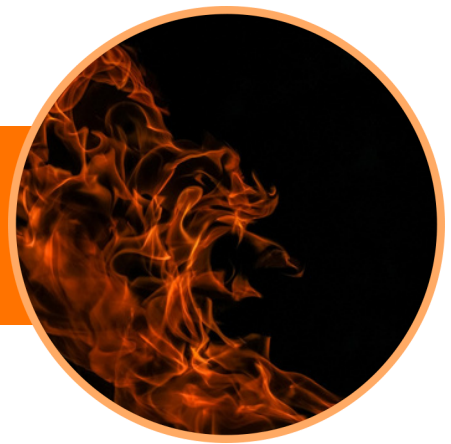
A synagogue service always included prayer and readings from the scriptures. Rabbis—and visiting rabbis—would also teach. Most of Paul's teachings and healings took place in assemblies held in private homes.

## Ancient Home Synagogue

The term "synagogue" refers generally to a Jewish assembly for prayer. During the first-century AD, the term referred primarily to buildings designed to house such assemblies. Jews living in Greek towns usually assembled for prayer in private homes—and if an assembly member was wealthy, the synagogue might have been held in a home like this one.

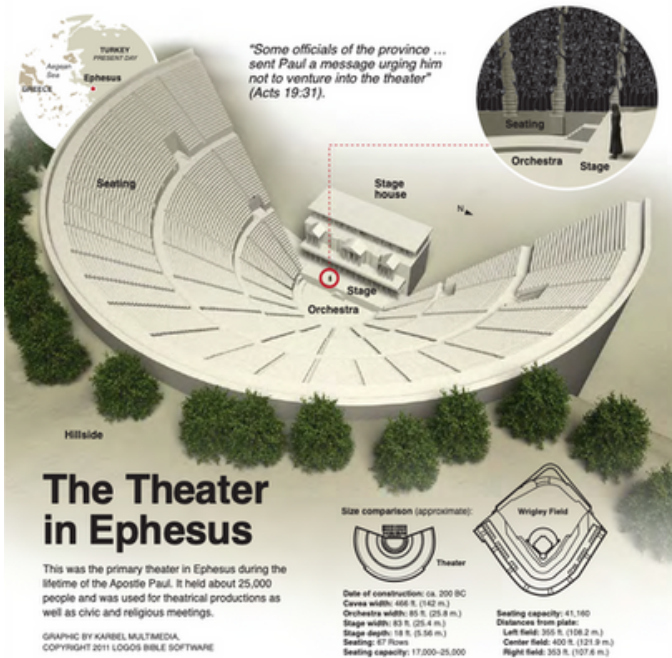

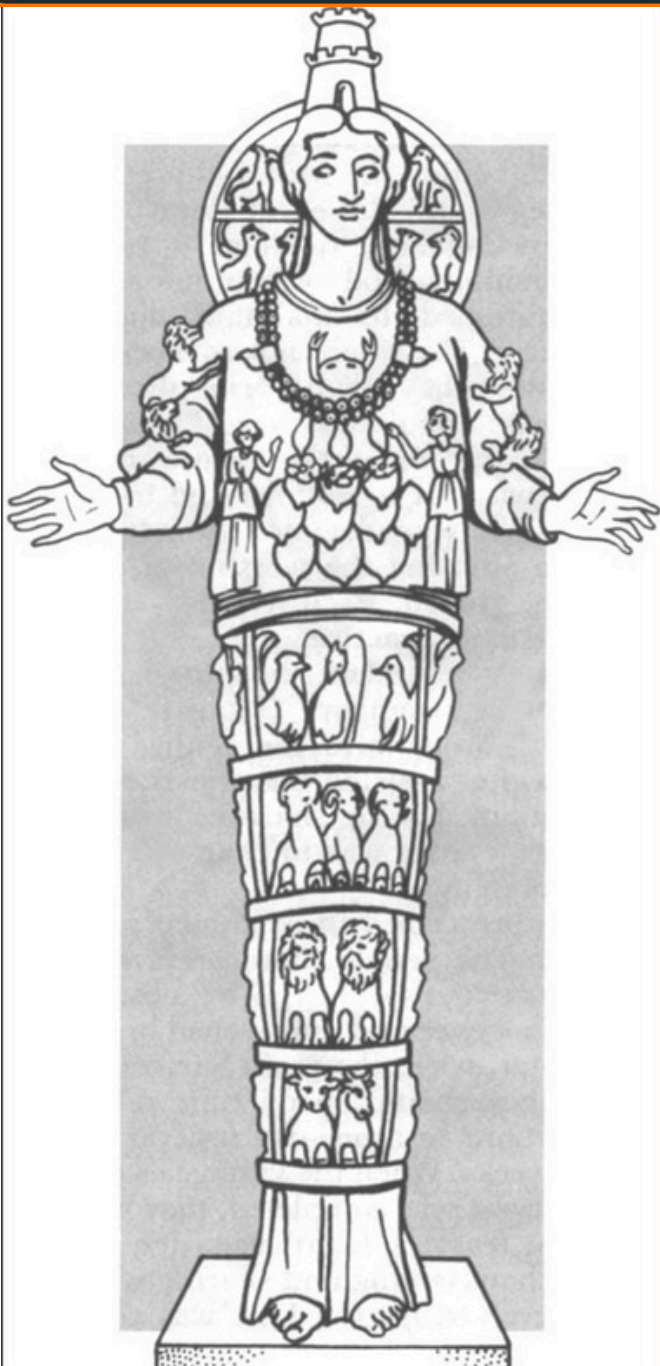

### Bronze Figure of Artemis

*Ephesus, Hellenistic (2nd-1st century BC)*

Statuettes like this and other artwork depicting the goddess Artemis were a crucial source of business for metalworkers and other craftsmen in Ephesus, home of the Artemision. Paul found himself at the center of a riot in Ephesus after angering Demetrius, a silversmith who made replicas of the temple of Artemis--Paul's evangelistic efforts had reduced the demand for items associated with the Greek goddess (Acts 19:21-40).

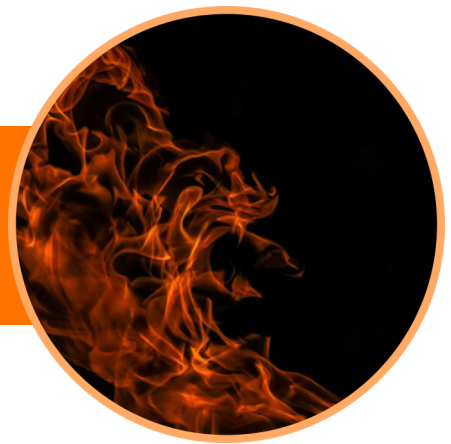
